

Knox, Szasz Will Fill One Event On Wrestling Card

Glen Knox, the slick-headed wrestling villain from Tennessee, has informed one and all that this Saturday will be his last appearance as a "preliminary boy" or else. The rough and tumble man, who defeated George Curtis in his last local appearance, will meet Al Szasz in the one-fall opener of Matchmaker Don Owen's mat show at the Roseburg Armory Saturday night.

"After Saturday I get main events or Oregon will lose the best wrestler ever to appear here—namely me," Knox announced.

Szasz, the bouncing young Hungarian, is rated just as high as Knox in light-heavyweight ranks and his drop-kicks will likely cause the southerner plenty of trouble. Szasz hasn't appeared here for nearly a year, but is well-known and extremely popular with Douglas county grappling followers.

Jack Kiser, the wrestling adon from St. Johns, will also be making his first appearance here in many months, in a semi-final engagement against Buck Weaver, the Indiana football and intercollegiate mat star. Kiser recently returned to Oregon after a successful campaign in Texas and other southwestern states. The muscular matman, the young est ever to hold a coast title, is in top form and his match against Weaver will likely be a scientific classic.

Holding top interest, however, will be the one-hour skirmish between "The Phantom and Gor-

don Hessel, two of the most sensational matmen now appearing in the northwest. The hooded hoodlum from Honolulu, in a short two weeks, has knocked over most of the "name" wrestlers in the business. He was extremely impressive here last week in defeating talented Joe Lynam in two straight falls.

Hessel, never beaten on the local mat, will not risk his coast light-heavyweight championship against the head-butting villain. The young New Mexico grappler, however, is confident he can stop the mystery man of the mat. It should be an outstanding exhibition between two of the most highly-regarded wrestlers now making the swing through north-west mat circles.

The Szasz-Knox opener will get under way at 8 P. M. before one of the largest crowds of the season. Elton Owen will be on hand to referee all three bouts.

Grants Pass High School's baseball team is scheduled to come here Saturday to play the Roseburg High Indians in two seven-inning ball games, starting at 2 P. M. on Finlay field.

The two teams started an initial contest two weeks ago at Grants Pass, but the game had to be called in the third inning because of rain. The score was knotted at 3-all, so there is not much to go by to determine the comparative strength of the teams.

Coach George Erickson of the Indians indicated there may be a considerable change in his lineup, after their 6 to 2 lacing at the hands of Myrtle Creek here Monday afternoon.

Roseburg's pitching staff is weak. The only player with experience is Chuck Scofield, who held up well the first few innings against Myrtle Creek, but weakened as the game wore on, and had to be replaced in the final innings.

While Scofield is due for plenty of work in Saturday's games, Tom Johnson, who relieved him Monday, will probably get another test. Ronnie Ollar and Wayne Reifman may also see action if the going gets tough.

Erickson said that none of the boys are sure of starting berths, but indicated most of the players who opened against Myrtle Creek would also start against Grants Pass.

Roseburg was weak in the hitting department. A shift of players may find a better batting combination, said Erickson.

Snell. Senator Pearson called briefly on local friends and political leaders.

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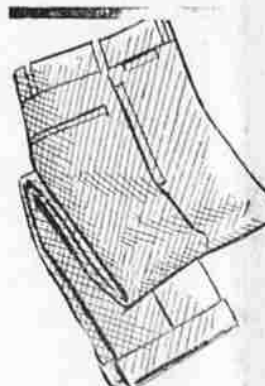
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
