UNECONOMICAL OPERATIONS

The April bulletin distributed by the State Game Commission outlines a large expansion program. Announcement is made of a new fish hatchery for the southwestern Oregon coastal area.

In addition to the hatchery operations now being expanded, the Game and Fish Commissions are seeking construction of a number of hatcheries on the Willamette River and its tributaries as a part of the Willamette Valley Project.

Many sportsmen and the general public will accept these hatchery improvements and additions as a forward step in the fisheries program, and rightly so. The public has been led to believe that hatcheries are the answer to rapid losses of fish population.

No one would deny that fish hatcheries are necessary. But their principal function appears to be that of stocking streams where angling intensity is greater than stream capacity.

But if the state should spend a few hundred thousand dollars in watershed improvement on the Clackamas, where trout food is less than one and one-half cubic centimeters per square foot, totally inadequate to support any abundance of fish life, the capacity of the river to support naturally spawned fish would be vastly improved.

The Game Commission, in our opinion, should select a comparatively small watershed—we propose the South Umpqua River basin—and seek cooperation from the state department of agriculture, state college, state board of forestry and any other affected agencies, and set up an experiment in watershed restoration.
