Barneburg's Candidacy Endorsed, Three Retiring Instructors Honored

Approximately 70 teachers from Douglas County Schools gathered in Roseburg Saturday noon for a noon dinner meeting in the Methodist Church parlors and the reactivation of the Douglas County Division Oregon Education Association.

The meeting, presided over by Mrs. Faith Thompson, Sutherlin, association president, centered chiefly of discussion on the new constitution, appointment of committees and consideration of motions, and general reorganization procedure.

Named on the constitution committee were Glenn Brady, Roseburg, chairman; Ivan Parker, Myrtle Creek; Walter Gerlach, Sutherlin, and Mrs. Leona Madison, Elkton. R. R. Brand, Roseburg, and Omer J. Monger, Glendale, were named as financial assistants to the committee.

Mrs. Margaret Adair, Roseburg, was appointed membership committee chairman; Mrs. Cleone Andrus, Wilbur, publicity chairman; Mrs. Leona Madison, Elkton, nominating committee chairman; Edwin Wyatt, Glendale, resolutions chairman.

The association voted to continue with the present officers until the first fall meeting. They include, besides Mrs. Thompson as president, George Childress, Days Creek, vice-president, and Mrs. Bonita Wikoff, Roseburg, secretary - treasurer. The next meeting is to be called by the president.

Barneburg Endorsed
The association went on record as endorsing the candidacy of Kenneth Barneburg for the office of county school superintendent. A report on the credit union organized in the Roseburg schools, but open to membership for all teachers in the county, was made by Stanley Glick.

Denis McGuire, Portland, field director for the Oregon Education Association, addressed the group briefly. He explained principally, the proposed initiative measure, for which petitions are being circulated to place it on the November election ballot, which would make it possible for all voters in the school district eligible for general elections to cast their ballots in school elections, bond issues and special budget votings. This privilege is now limited to property owners. Another measure the association is advocating is a retirement bill for teachers, he explained.

Glenn Linn, Jackson county director of the OEA, was a guest and discussed his county division and gave helpful hints for the Douglas County group to follow.

Three Teachers Retire
In honor of their faithful services as school teachers in Douglas county, three retiring teachers were introduced and presented pins from the retirement association. They are Miss Ruth Swiney, Roseburg, Pullerton School second grade teacher; Miss Alice Ueland, Roseburg High mathematics teacher, and Mrs. Belle Clark, Dillard. The presentations were

made by Mrs. Lula C. Gorrell, county school superintendent. A motion introduced providing a 25 cents per member rebate from the OEA fund to active teacher organizations in first class school districts was voted approval when first presented, but the vote was reversed after a counter motion was presented to extend the rebate to all active teacher organizations in the county. This latter motion was voted down, but because there had been some discussion on the original proposal, a reconsideration vote carried the proposal to defeat, and it was referred to the constitution committee.

Roseburg Superintendent of Schools Paul S. Elliot opened the program with a greeting message; Holly Nicholas sang two solos; The Sutherlin High girls quartet sang three numbers, and the Roseburg High triple trio also sang two selections.

Nurse Profession Pay Now Highest In Its History

"Unlimited opportunities" with the highest pay schedules in history are open to young women in the nursing field today with even greater possibilities in view, Miss Olive Slocum of the School of Nursing, University of Oregon Medical School told the girls of Roseburg Senior High School Thursday.

"The nurse serves her community side by side with the finest people in town," Miss Slocum said. "Among the many widening fields open to the well-prepared graduate nurse are: hospital administration, private duty, research, teaching, airlines, foreign service, U. S. Armed Forces, U. S. Public Health Service, Veterans Administration, industry and various specialized forms of nursing. Her training is also of incalculable value to her as a wife and mother."

"As a profession, nurses now have a voice in determining their working conditions," The Oregon State Nurses Association, already recognized as a bargaining agent for nurses in this area by the Hospital Association of Oregon, has a definite program underway which looks toward a 40-hour work week in the near future, improvement in pay and working conditions and responsibilities of the profession.

"Modern methods of student training with emphasis on clinical techniques in general or specialized fields have been adopted by the School of Nursing on the University of Oregon Medical campus in Portland."

"Advancement in the field of nursing is open to all ambitious girls. Advanced specialized training advances by almost 50 per cent the salary range," she said.

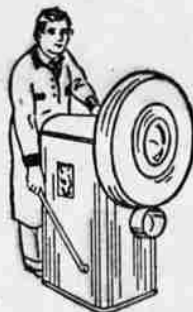
Extracting the fangs does not make a poisonous snake harmless since a number of replacement fangs in various stages of development usually are present.

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Scout Activities To be Discussed

Scoutmasters, assistant scoutmasters and scout commissioners of Douglas County will convene Wednesday at 7:30 p. m. in the Roseburg Chamber of Commerce rooms for a general round table discussion of coming scouting activities, reports District Scout Executive Harold J. Ylvisaker.

Five major activities, which apply to all scout troops in the district, will come up for consideration. They are:

Other vital business will also be discussed, said Ylvisaker.

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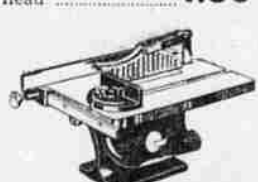
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
