

## Phantom Defeats Hessell; Weaver, Kiser Stage Draw

Gregory from a flying leap through the ropes when he missed his opponent, Gordon Hessell, Pacific coast light-heavyweight champion, fell easy prey to a series of elbow smashes and a figure-four toe-hold applied by "The Phantom" in Saturday night's Armory wrestling card.

Prior to this third and deciding fall in just four minutes time, both wrestlers battled outside the ropes until separated by Referee Elton Owen. Back in the ring, Hessell's attempted flying shoulder but failed as he pummeled out onto the floor, and was just able to climb back as Owen tolled the count. His ankle was injured and he had to be helped from the ring.

The Phantom, who hasn't lost a match in Oregon since his recent arrival from Honolulu, took the second fall in nine minutes with his sure specialty figure-four toe-hold, after knocking Hessell stiffly with a series of head butts. The popular Hessell, New Mexico's mat contribution whose title was not at stake in the overtime match, won the first fall in 14 minutes with a suddenly executed reverse flying head scissors, which caused the Phantom to pat the mat.

The hooded villain found the going considerably tougher against Hessell than against Joe Lynn, whom he defeated in two straight falls a week ago. Hessell had him in trouble time and again, but the Phantom managed to break the holds by fair means or foul.

The half hour semi-windup between Jack Kiser and Buck Weaver went to a half-hour draw. The match was hard fought, but neither could apply enough pressure for a deciding fall. Except for a few minor outbursts, the bout was clean, but a crowd pleaser because of the fast action. The wrestlers slowed noticeably toward the end from sheer exhaustion. In the final minute, Weaver broke a punishing hammer lock by patting Kiser on the shoulder. Kiser, thinking it was the referee giving him the fall, broke, but the bell sounded ending the bout.

At 5:30, returning to the local mat after a long absence, was awarded the only fall of the 20 minute curtain raiser on a foul after 10 minutes wrestling, when his opponent, Glenn Knox, picked him up and slammed him on the corner ropes. When he failed to break, Referee Owen pulled him off and awarded the match to Szasz.

Both Bennett and Talbot, heavyweights, are putting in plenty of training for the fight. Talbot, who has been fighting around Portland, is hoping to get by Bennett and be in line for a chance at Joe Katut, Woodburn scrapper, and Roy Hawkins of Seattle. Bennett, who has met some of the toughest fighters in the years gone by, hopes himself to be on the comeback trail and is getting in excellent condition with daily workouts.

Fenton, who fought Joey Dolan for the Pacific Coast bantamweight title several years back, is said to have a formidable opponent in Lovt, sparring partner for Joe Ortega, up and coming Pacific Coast fighter.

Reserved seat tickets have been placed on sale at the J V Sporting Goods store and will also go on sale in Myrtle Creek and Sutherlin.

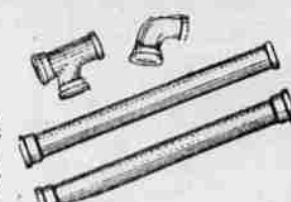
