

Mrs. S. L. Kidder Named Oregon Mother of 1948

(Continued from Page One) Manila where she remained him prior to the second World War, taking an active part in church and fraternal affairs in Manila. Fortitude in Prison

Mr. and Mrs. Kidder were interned at Santo Tomas prison camp early in the war. During the 37 months of imprisonment, Mrs.

Kidder's health was badly impaired and her weight dropped to 84 pounds. But despite suffering and privation, she retained her courage, spending two hours daily in preparing food for camp meals and assisting the sick. During the shelling of Santo Tomas Feb. 7 and 9, 1945, when many internees were killed or wounded, she was of aid in quieting panic-stricken women and children and assisting the injured. Since her release from Santo Tomas and her return to Rose-

burg, she has resumed her place in family and civic life. As a mother, her interest has centered in her family. Her three sons were encouraged in gaining education and were trained in responsibility. Even in grade school, each boy was encouraged to find work and to discharge his duties efficiently. Eldest Son Linguist

Stanley the eldest son, was active in Boy Scouting, rose to the rank of Eagle Scout and was a qualified Red Cross swimming instructor. Graduating in pre-medicine from the University of Oregon he went to the Philippines in 1938 as a purchasing agent for the Navy. He and his wife, the former Lucia Booth, secretary in the office of the High Commissioner, were interned in Santo Tomas and Los Banos after the fall of the Philippines. During his period of internment, he became proficient in the Chinese, Japanese, German and Spanish languages and has since entered the service of the State Department and is serving as a vice-consul in China. Robert was graduated from Un-

iversity of Oregon with a degree in physical education. He was supervisor of athletics at the state training school at Woodburn, Ore., prior to entering military service as a reserve officer in 1942. He served three years in Alaska and was advanced to rank of major. He is now supervisor of special services at the veterans facility in Roseburg. James, was graduated from West Point with the class of 1943 and was with the 7th Army when it entered Germany. He is now a captain, located in Santa Barbara. He wears the Silver Star and Presidential citation. Mrs. Kidder has four grandchildren, Robert being father of a son and a daughter, and James the father of two sons.

(Continued From Page One) the support of other anti-Communist minor parties. The total anti-Communist vote of all parties in the chamber race, on the basis of the nearly complete returns, was 17,030,386, and in the Senate vote, final official returns, 15,282,582.

The Chamber of Deputies is elected for five years, and the Senators have six-year terms. Thus, Italy seems assured of an anti-Communist government at least until 1953, barring unforeseen upheavals. Giuseppe Romita, left wing Socialist and former interior minister, joined with five other members of his party in an invitation to members to take steps to "regain the independence" of the Socialist party. The left wingers under Pietro Nenni had split with the Independent Socialists over the Communist fusion issue and allied themselves with the Communists in the Popular Front.

(Continued From Page One) hinge largely on whether the miners are back at work by then. Last night Lewis sent telegrams to all district presidents saying it was his wish that the miners go back to work. The district presidents were passing the word along to individual miners.

There still was widespread idleness in the coal fields today. Many miners obviously were so over the whopping fines Goldsborough imposed. But signs were strong that normal operations of the mines may be resumed within a few days at the latest. A majority of the 400,000 soft coal miners returned to work April 12, after telegrams from Lewis said their \$100 monthly pensions for aging workers had been granted. But the court tug-of-war angered some, and there was a wave of protest walkouts yesterday.
