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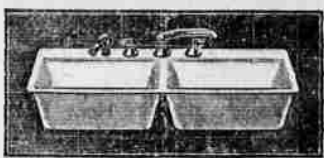

**Swim Class, Tree
Planting Slated
For Scout Groups**

Boy Scouts of Douglas County will keep busy this weekend, with a swimming class at the University of Oregon Friday night, and a tree planting program Saturday. It was announced following a Scoutmasters' roundtable meeting, conducted by District Scout Executive Harold J. Ylvisaker, Wednesday night in the Chamber of Commerce rooms.

Approximately 60 boys will leave from the Presbyterian church Friday for the trip in a chartered bus to Eugene for the first of a series of three swimming classes, the next two dates being April 30 and May 7. The boys will pay part of their transportation and tank fee, and the Roseburg Elks Lodges is underwriting the remainder of the cost for the trip.

On Saturday a similar number of boys will leave from the Presbyterian church at 8 a. m. in a truck furnished by the Roseburg Lumber Company for the White Creek area on Little River near Glide, where they will spend the day planting seedling trees. The planting will be under the supervision of the District Ranger, George Churchill, of the Glide station in the Umpqua National Forest. The boys will take sandwiches, but a hot drink will be furnished.

If Weather Permits
It is announced that the trip will not be made if the weather is unfavorable, and the boys are instructed to listen for the early morning news broadcast over Radio Station KRNR for a cancellation notice, if the weather is stormy.

Other important business, about which further information will be published later, was arrangement for a district court of honor May 3. This will be held outside at the Kiwanis park, if the weather permits. There will be special events and demonstrations by the various troops.

The final overnight session for scoutmasters' basic training course was set for May 29 and 30 at Winchester. The district camporee will be June 5 and 6 at the Wolf Creek Scout camp.

**Bus Driver Dies After
Ejecting Passenger**

PORTLAND, April 22.—(AP)—A bus driver dropped dead at the wheel of his vehicle yesterday shortly after ejecting a passenger.

Washington County Sheriff's Deputy M. T. Bazzel said the passenger, Monroe H. Dean, 42, of suburban Cedar Hills had been killed at Hillsboro on a charge of intoxication.

Bazzel said passengers told him the driver, Sam G. Paisley, 47, ordered Dean to leave the Oregon Motor Stages bus at the West Slope stop. When Dean refused, Paisley dragged him off, returned and sat down at the wheel, then collapsed. The bus was not in motion.

**Apprenticeship
Training by 13
Firms Approved**
