WASHINGTON, (AP)—Sailors' dress uniforms soon will be minus the famous 13 buttons on the trousers and buttoned cuffs on the jumpers.

Instead new blues, which will be issued in a few months, will have conventional front trousers with hip and slash side pockets. And coat style sleeves will replace the buttoned cuffs.

Secretary of the Navy Sullivan has approved the changes, it was announced.

Visitation Day Set for Future 9th Grade Pupils

The annual visitation day at Roseburg Junior High School for all eighth grade students from the outlying districts who will come into Roseburg for their ninth grade schooling next year will be held Wednesday, April 28, announced R. R. Brand, Junior High principal.

Districts which have no high schools and send their eighth grade graduates to Roseburg for the one year at Junior High before they enter Roseburg Senior High are Wilbur, St. Joseph (Catholic) of Roseburg, Green, South Deer Creek, Tenmile, Lookingsburg, Roberts Creek, Reston, Umpqua, Cleveland, Melrose, Upper Olalla, Gilegany, Elgarose, Callahan and Dillard.

Purpose of the visitation is to acquaint the prospective new students with the Junior High School and to give them an understanding of the subjects they will want to study.

After registration in the morning, the pupils will spend a good portion of the day attending ninth grade classes. There will be a general assembly program, noon time recreation and entertainment, and lunches available at the school cafeteria.

In the afternoon there will be a conference period when instruction will be given regarding selection of subjects for the next year. The students will have a choice of two subjects.

Following the visitation, the students may confer with their parents and teachers in their respective schools before making out their registration for the subjects they desire. Upon these registration cards, to be mailed back to the Junior High, the next year's schedule can be based. The students may make minor revisions in their registration at the start of the school year in the fall.

Eastern Railroad President, Local Residents Confer

A business trip in a private railroad car can be something of a pleasure trip as well. Charles J. Graham, president of the Pittsburgh and West Virginia Railroad, a Roseburg visitor Tuesday, has seen quite a bit of the country from his private car during an extensive tour of the Northwest.

He conferred here with local railroad and business people, entertaining them at luncheon and dinner in the car.

Purpose of his visit, he explained, is to persuade shippers in the Northwest to route their products east by way of Pittsburgh. As a "bridge line," his railroad is an important freight carrier serving many other railways entering the Pittsburgh area.

Graham was accompanied by Carl G. Anderson, his general agent at Portland. The tour began at Klamath Falls last week and has included several Oregon and Washington cities. Graham said he regretted not being able to see

more of the scenery, since he travels at night.

At each stop, telephone connections are made with the car. Graham maintains daily contact with his headquarters at Pittsburgh. He said he learned that Ohio River flood waters had gotten in the basement of the company's office building.

Graham commented on the growth of the lumber industry here and added that he hoped to increase the shipments of lumber East.

Banks to Grant Japan Huge Loan

WASHINGTON, April 22.—(AP)—The government-owned Export-Import Bank said yesterday it will join three private banks in making a \$60,000,000 loan to finance shipment of American cotton to Japan.

The Export-Import Bank will

provide \$29,000,000 of the credit. The remaining \$31,000,000 is to be furnished by the Chase National and National City Banks of New York and the Bank of America at San Francisco. All three have branches in Japan.

Japanese mills are to make textiles from the cotton. Forty per cent of the cotton cloth produced will be consumed in Japan and the rest sold in Japan's pre-war export markets, the bank said.

Earlier, the bank gave a similar but smaller cotton credit to U. S. occupied Germany.

The bank said Gen. Douglas MacArthur, allied supreme commander in Japan, believes the cotton loan to that country will be of major help in restoring Japan's cotton textile industry.

Germans Kidnaped By Russians, Put in Camps

(By the Associated Press) The American military government at Berlin published today a list of 45 Germans who have disappeared from the western sectors of Berlin and charged that most of them were kidnaped or otherwise illegally arrested by the Russians.

In several cases it was officially charged that the Russians are holding Germans in concentration camps. Among the camps named were Sachsenhausen and Buchenwald, formerly operated by the Nazis.

German Socialists have charged officially that more than 1,600 such disappearances have occurred in Berlin since the end of the war.

Col. Frank L. Howley, U. S. commandant of Berlin, has stated publicly that a reign of terror is being waged against anti-Communists in the Russian sector of Berlin.

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PRIZE

1 cake compressed yeast
2 tablespoons sugar
2 teaspoons salt
2 tablespoons shortening
2 cups water or scalded milk
6 cups Crown Best Patent Flour

Soften yeast in part of lukewarm liquid. Add sugar, salt and shortening to balance of lukewarm liquid. Add liquids to flour, stir well to incorporate, knead till smooth and elastic. Set in greased bowl covered with damp cloth. Let rise till light, about 2 hours. Fold dough over and let rise about 30 minutes. Cut in half and roll up to fit pans. Cover and let rise till light, about 60 minutes. Bake at 425° F. for about 30 minutes. Makes two loaves.

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
