unless United Nations action meanwhile changes the situation.

The sources said Arab leaders are convinced they have underestimated Jewish power and that the Arab volunteer army now in Palestine will not be enough to withstand it.

In London, the British war office announced last night the Middle East command is being reshuffled in view of plans to drop the mandate and to pull all British troops out of Palestine by Aug. 1.

The United States is reported to have abandoned plans to call for a special international police force for Palestine. However, the Americans are believed ready to insist upon creation of a truce commission to carry out the Security Council's cease fire order of a week ago.

Morrison. Judge Goldsborough said "the court is more than happy to know that the normal situation is being restored."

"The court postpones indefinitely any sentencing for civil contempt."

"All right, gentlemen," Goldsborough said without looking toward Lewis, who was in his customary place, "the matter is disposed of, and this court is adjourned."

Injunction Holds. After the session, Morrison had what amounted to an informal news conference with reporters.

In response to questions, he said that as long as the injunction granted by Goldsborough is in effect, any new coal strike could be punished with new penalties for both criminal and civil contempt.

The injunction runs for 80 days—unless the attorney general becomes convinced that the dispute is settled and asks the court to dismiss the injunction.

The government contends the 80 days starts when full production of coal resumes.

Morrison was asked if the 80-day period starts today. He replied:

"No. Not until we get production like that of the week ending March 12. It would be silly to say otherwise."

That was the last week before the miners began walking out March 15.
