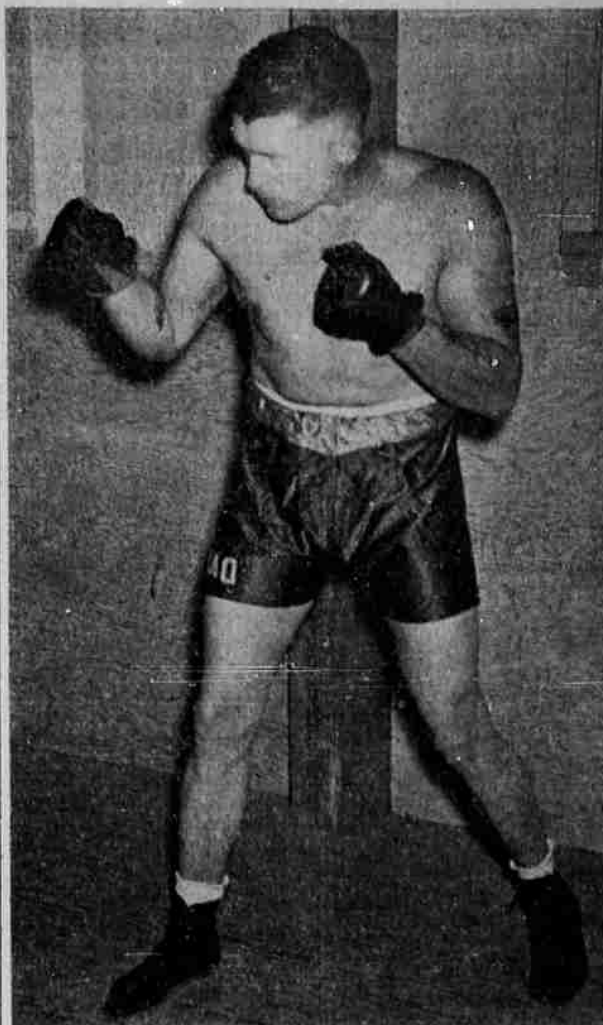

Rodeo Queen Selection Scheduled for Sunday

Ability to ride, horsemanship and general appearance will be the points upon which a secret committee from the Douglas County Sheriff's Posse will base its decision in selecting a queen for Roseburg's fourth annual Rodeo June 19 and 20.

The queen will be chosen this Sunday, May 2, at 11 a. m., rain or shine, at the Fair Grounds, according to Rodeo Superintendent Dick Baker.

All single girls between the ages of 16 and 22 years will be eligible to compete Sunday. The girls must provide their own mounts, but a costume will be furnished the winner by the Rodeo committee. Four princesses are also to be chosen to make up the queen's court. The coronation will be at a western dress-up parade June 11.

Major Parties In Red on Campaign

WASHINGTON, (AP)—The Republican and Democratic national committees ran into the red in financing the first two months of this campaign year.

But the national Wallace for President Committee, the CIO Political Action Committee and Americans for Democratic Action said they spent less than they took in.

The financial records on display in the office of the clerk of the house included: The Republican National committee showed contributions of \$90,834.41 and expenses of \$129,492.64, a difference of \$38,658.23. The Democratic National committee said it received \$16,022 and spent \$190,861, a difference of \$174,839.

The Wallace committee said it took in \$65,647 and paid out \$55,417, leaving \$10,230 in the war chest.
