### Boeing Strike In Deadlock Stage

SEATTLE, April 29.—Prospects of an early meeting to seek an end to the Boeing strike dimmed today as the walkout of 15,000 Seattle employees went into its eighth day.

Conditions specified for such a meeting indicated a new deadlock between management and union heads.

The company declined yesterday an invitation from Federal conciliators to meet with the

Aeronautical Mechanics union but said it would meet with the parent International Association of Machinists (Ind).  
President William M. Allen of Boeing notified conciliators that the company would not meet with AMU officials because, he contended, the local union "is no longer a collective bargaining agency under the NLRA (National Labor Relations Act)." He declared it had lost that privilege because the strike "was in violation of the contract." He also asserted that "those on strike are no longer employees of the company."
