(Associated Press Sports Writer) Things are looking up for Billy Southworth and his Boston Braves after a week of disaster. Excellent pitching jobs by Spahn, Barrett and Voiselle have lifted the would-be contenders from the cellar gloom.

Spahn's first win of the season yesterday marked the return to normalcy of Manager Southworth's gang. For Spahn and Sain, as 20-game winners last year, were expected to lead the Braves toward the 1948 flag. Spahn missed his first time out and Sain failed twice.

It was Voiselle's three-hit shut-out of Brooklyn that yanked the Braves off the floor Monday. Barrett followed with a six-hitter Tuesday. Then came Spahn's two-hit gem against the Phillies.

In three games this off-maligned staff yielded only 11 hits and two runs. Billy never had to call on his bullpen.

Spahn's job was a real sparkler. He faced only 28 Phillies in his 7-0 victory, walked none and fanned four.

Vander Mees made it a left-handed day in the national by stopping Chicago with six hits while his Cincinnati mates clubbed Schmitz and Caslen for 12 hits.

The Red's southpaw reversed the trend of his first outing when he walked 12 men. Yesterday he passed only two assuring himself of win No. 1 by an 8-1 score.

The victory put the Reds in a four-way tie for second place at 500.

Two Catchers Injured
There was bad news for Cincy, too. Catcher Ray Mueller fractured his right ankle sliding into home. He will be out for 60 days.

The New York-Brooklyn game was rained out but both clubs provided disturbing news. From the Giants came word that Catcher Walker Cooper, who has hit four homers, has a chip fracture on his left knee. He will be out for several days.

Pitcher Harry Taylor of the Dodgers learned he may have to undergo an appendicitis operation.

He is being held in a hospital for further examination.

Detroit took the sole American league game, 9-4, over St. Louis with a 15-hit assault on four pitchers.

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Fenton Declares He'll Make Good In Coming Bout

"Some Roseburg folks think I'm all washed up as a fighter, but when I go in the ring next Tuesday night I'm going to prove I'm just as good as I ever was," declared Babe Fenton, who will meet Billy Dove of Portland in the semi-final bout of Tuesday's professional fight card at the Armory.

Dallas Bennett, Roseburg's "fighting cop," will be featured in the main event against Leo Talbot of Portland. The curtain-raised, still to be announced, is slated to start at 8:30 p.m.

Fenton said he lost his last fight against Hal Freeze in Salem in December, but that he realized he was not in the best of condition. He said he is in good condition now and is willing to meet Freeze in a return match at any time.

"I've got to make a showing," said Fenton. "I've got a wife and

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four daughters depending on me to make good."

Fenton, who held the Oregon lightweight championship in 1940 and 1941, fought Joey Dolan, Portland, in 1943 for the feather-weight championship, but lost. Other fighters he has met include Johnny Woods, Duane "Buzsaw" Hoag, and Seward Bergstrom, all Northwest fighters.

Bennett, Fenton and "Sugar" Ray Brewster, 145 pounds, of Sutherlin are holding nightly workouts in the gymnasium under the football field grandstand. Bennett who claims he is in the pink of condition at 180 pounds, sparred several rounds with Fenton and Brewster Wednesday night, but was unable to open up the lighter fellows. The boxers also worked several rounds shadow boxing, punching the bag and pounding the sand bags.

Brewster will fight a special event, his opponent to be announced later, and three four-round preliminaries will round out the card, according to promoters Bill Olsen and Rudy Schlotthauer.

3 tablespoons hot shortening
4 cups finely diced, cooked potatoes
¼ cup finely cut onion

1 teaspoon salt
1½ grains pepper
1 cup Fat Milk
2 tablespoons finely cut parsley (can omit)

Put shortening into skillet. Add potatoes and onion. Cook slowly 15 minutes, turning as mixture browns. Add remaining ingredients; cook slowly 10 minutes longer, or until mixture thickens. Serve hot. Makes 4 servings.
