

Johnson to Take On Phantom In Mat Semi-Final

Gust Johnson, the Seattle schoolmaster who is one of the really great grapplers coming out of the Pacific Northwest, will meet Frankie Hart, the talented and popular French-Canadian, in the semi-final attraction of Matchmaker Don Owen's weekly wrestling show at the Roseburg Armory Saturday night.

Johnson, making his first appearance here for nearly two years, was extremely impressive in disposing of rough and tough Glen Knox here last week. Hart, with his spinning toe-hold and wide assortment of holds, will furnish entirely different competition and the bout may turn into one of the best scientific skirmishes in months. Scientific wrestling is right down Johnson's alley—what with his well-executed leg strangle and surfboard holds.

The semi-final will be in marked contrast to the headliner—an inevitable Donnybrook between The Phantom and Paavo Kotonen, and a match that is expected to fill the Armory to the rafters with followers who like their wrestling wild and woolly.

The Phantom has been riding rough shod over all opposition since his arrival in the Northwest a few weeks ago from Honolulu, and his local triumphs include decisions over two top-flight matmen—Gordon Hessel and Joe Lynam.

In Kotonen, ringbirds predict the mystery man of the mat will be meeting a foe who will test him to the limit—a wrestler capable of absorbing the brutal punishment of his head-butting and a mat-wise performer who has mastered virtually every hold in modern grappling.

If the hooded hoodlum can get past Kotonen he will be matched in the very near future with Rufus "Puddin' Head" Jones, Detroit Negro who ranks as one of the ten top matmen in the world. The Finnish matmaster, if he upsets the Phantom, will get the bout against Jones.

It looks like a rough evening for Referee Elton Owen, but an evening packed with fireworks and entertainment for the spectators. The opener gets under way at 8:30 p.m.

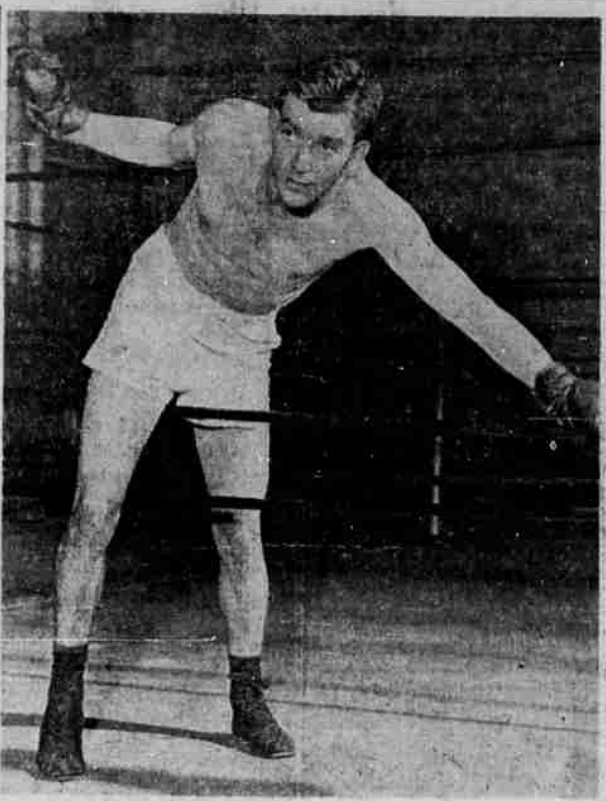

Corvallis Voters Okay Excess School Levy

CORVALLIS, Ore., April 30.—(AP)—Corvallis voters this week approved measures to allow the city school district to exceed the six per cent limitation by \$127,915 for the coming school year, and also approved a five-mill tax for five years to provide for a building fund.

Voting was very light. The six per cent vote was 322 to 155 and authorizing the serial levy 323 to 152.

Bennett Will Be 'Scouted' for Bout On Benefit Card

George Eckstein, battling behemoth of the Grante Pass police department, and Police Chief Carl M. Dallas will be in Roseburg Tuesday, May 4, to scout Dallas Bennett, 180-pound Roseburg officer, in his fight with Leo Talbot of Portland, according to word received here.

Eckstein is tentatively scheduled to meet Bennett at Roseburg on a police benefit card June 16. Bennett is fast rounding into shape for his first professional match since he was discharged from the service. He last fought in Naples, Italy, two years ago, while in the army.

The Roseburg fighter said he is down to his best weight, and is confining his nightly workouts at the gym under the football field grandstand to conditioning exercises and a few rounds of sparring and shadow boxing to develop his timing, speed and endurance.

Babe Fenton of Roseburg and Sutherlin will fight Bill Dove, Portland, in the semi-final, and "Sugar" Roy Brewster, pride of Sutherlin, is slated to appear in a special event. In addition three four-round preliminaries will be on the card.
