

Arrangements For Baby Show Made

A feature of the contest will be the physical examination for each entrant, with engraved health certificates to be awarded those scoring 90 percent; "Blue Ribbon" certificates for 90 percent; and "Gold Seal" diplomas to those scoring 98 to 100 percent.

The Baby Beauty Parade will be held at Knights of Pythias Hall May 19. Blue ribbons will be awarded the "prettiest girl" and "most handsome and manly" little boy in each of six age classes. The Coronation Pageant, May 26, at Junior High School auditorium, will feature tiny kings and queens and their attending courts in each of several age classes. Skyways Over Highway 99 Will be Marked

WASHINGTON. —(AP)— Skyways 99 and 101—two 40-mile wide strips along which air mark-

ers will be visible from an altitude of 1000 feet or more—have been officially designated by the Civil Aeronautics Administration.

Skyway 99 stretches from Vancouver, B. C., to San Diego, Calif., following highway 99 quite closely and passing over Seattle, Tacoma, Portland, Salem, Eugene, Medford, Roseburg, Sacramento, Stockton, Fresno and Bakersfield in Washington, Ore., and California.

Skyway 101 extends from Seattle to Los Angeles along the Pacific Coast.

The designations were announced by the CAA.

"Bark" in Boy's Throat Proves to be Toy Dog

SEATTLE. —(AP)— When Alan Alhadeff, 2, began talking with a "bark" his parents thought he had asthma. They said later a metal toy dog had been removed from his throat.

Shortly after Christmas the boy's breathing became difficult, said Alan's mother, Mrs. Jack Alhadeff. When the "wheezing" increased he was taken to a doctor who x-rays child's patients as a matter of course.

Sharply outlined on the film was an inch-long toy dog, caught in Alan's esophagus and pressing against his windpipe. It affected his breathing and made it hard for him to eat solid food.

A specialist removed the toy in an operation lasting an hour and a half. The Alhadeffs said they had never seen the toy before and don't know where their son picked it up.

Moses Parrott Home of 1880 Still Occupied by Last of Family

A land mark at the south end of the city is the old Parrott home, seen by all who travel in or out by way of the Pacific Highway. The house is surrounded by five acres of landscaped gardens and distinguished by its turret and spire.

Built in 1880 by the late Moses Parrott, the house occupies part of the original donation land claim taken up by him in 1852. He had come across the plains with his wife, Tennessee, from St. Louis, Mo., in the 'fifties.

The original Parrott home was a low, rambling structure to which Moses was said to have added a room with each addition to the family. He and his wife had 10 children in all and the last of them, Miss Rosa Parrott, now lives in the present house.

Miss Parrott, in the midst of spring housecleaning, received her interviewer in the kitchen. She recalled that the Parrott estate once extended from the top of the hills, east of her home, to the South Umpqua River. Most of the land has been sold and subdivided. Highways and the railway have been pushed thru. Now industrial areas are encroaching upon the scene.

When asked if she ever detected the signs of future success of students in her classes, she smiled as she replied: "Some of those I didn't think so much of have done almost as well as those I thought a great deal of."

Working in her garden, collecting fans, and writing now take up most of her time. Miss Parrott writes an occasional short story, "much to the disgust of my critics," she said. Her fan collection includes fans from all parts of the world.

Flowers and shrubs representative of many parts of the United

States grow in the gardens. The tower room, once a sitting room with its sweeping view of the valley, now is a conservatory for Miss Parrott's geraniums.

Bennett Eager For Another Battle With Joe Kahut

Wiley Spivey, Portland boxing promoter who manages Leo Talbot, will arrive in Roseburg Tuesday with a group of boxers to appear on the professional fight card being promoted by Bill Olson and Rudy Schlotthauer.

Talbot, 185 pounds, will meet Dallas Bennett, 180, in the main event of the card scheduled for 8:30 p. m. in the Armory. Spivey will bring Billy Dove, who meets Babe Fenton in the semi-final, as well as some fighters for the preliminaries.

Bennett is on the comeback trail after an absence from the

ring of nearly two years, and hopes if he can get by Talbot he will be in a position to get a shot at Joe Kahut, Woodburn heavyweight, who is headlining Portland cards.

The Roseburg fighter met Kahut, but lost the fight before entering the service in 1943, and he has been anxious to get a return bout, he said.

This will be Roseburg's first professional fight card in many months, and its success will have a bearing on future engagements here. A Police benefit card has been tentatively slated in June with Bennett as one of the headliners.

Tickets are on sale at the J. V. Sporting Goods Store, Grand Cafe and Wally's Pastime in Roseburg. Reserved seats are listed at \$2.40 and general admission at \$1.50.
