

Five Men Indicted In Theft of Meat From Army Depot

SEATTLE, April 30.—(AP)—A federal grand jury yesterday indicted five persons in connection with the theft of meat from the army's Auburn general depot.

An ex-convict, in charge of the cold storage plant at the depot for about three years, was one of those indicted, officers said. He was William McKinley Finney, 44, who served eight years in San Quentin prison on a robbery charge. He was accused of stealing about 1,100 pounds of frozen meat.

The jury criticized persons responsible for promoting Finney "to a position of trust and authority, with records readily available showing Finney previously had been convicted of a crime."

Three men who worked under Finney also were indicted. They were Arthur C. Reek, 22, and Alexander Crosby, 29, both of Auburn, accused of stealing one box of hams each, and Erbine Grubbe, 26, also of Auburn, charged with stealing about 1,100 pounds of meat.

George Swift, Jr., Auburn meat-market operator, was charged with having in his possession 20 boxes of stolen frozen meat. Swift is in California under bond.

The thefts occurred between last June 1 and Sept. 30, the indictments said.

The jury criticized persons responsible for promoting Finney "to a position of trust and authority, with records readily available showing Finney previously had been convicted of a crime."

Suspects Freed In Death of Rancher

CANYON CITY, Ore., May 3.—(P)—Three companions of a wealthy Condon area rancher found drowned in the John Day River have been released.

Justice of Peace Hoverson at a preliminary hearing held there was not sufficient evidence to hold the trio for the grand jury. The three—Robert E. Galtray, Elmer L. Powell and Roy R. Ragan, all of Mitchell—were charged with stealing Earl A. Smith's truck which contained the rancher's wallet, watch and other possessions.

Smith's body was recovered from the river April 17. He had been missing since April 16.

Dr. Howard Richardson, Portland criminologist who performed an autopsy, reported Smith had drowned. He said there was no evidence of foul play.

Smith's companions contended they were en route to notify authorities when they were arrested by state police.

They testified Smith, 55, had disappeared when the three went for a swim. Some of the missing man's clothing was found the next day on the bank of the river.

Experiment In Hot-House Crop Reedsport Success

REEDSPORT—John G. Murphy and John C. Slaughter announce that they are harvesting their crop of hot-house tomatoes raised in their recently-constructed hot-houses at Winchester Bay.

Murphy, who is a lather by trade, and Slaughter, his brother-in-law and a former railroad trainman, decided that they would like to experiment in the hot-house vegetable business and selected tomatoes as their crop.

Their business thus far has been a success and they have decided to enlarge their hot-house capacity, at the present time about 300 plants.

Most of their crop to date has been marketed in the Winchester Bay store, but the popularity of their product is becoming known outside and other grocers are making a bid for their fine tomatoes.

Their success demonstrates the fact that an experienced truck gardener would be a success in this district, as most of the vegetables sold in local groceries are shipped in by wholesalers and are usually of an inferior grade.

It has been clearly demonstrated that the soil and climate in this district is admirably suited

to the truck gardening business and there is little doubt that such a business would meet with ready assistance, not only from the merchants but with the public as a whole.

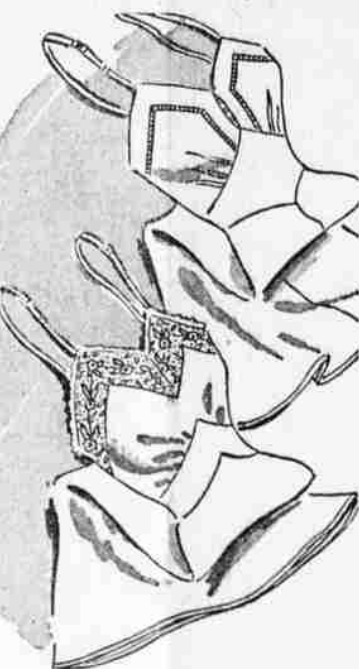

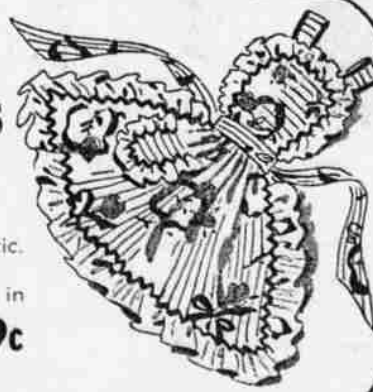
