Manpower Pool Gravelly Low, Head Of Legion Warns

INDIANAPOLIS, May 7.—(AP)—The American Legion had the word of its National Security Commission chairman today that armed forces should release all fit men from housekeeping duties and put them into combat training.

"Civilians can do the army's KP chores and all other non-combatant work," Perry Brown, of Beaumont, Tex., told the Legion's executive committee. "We're going to need fighters, and the sources from which we have to get them just are not producing them. The manpower pool is disastrously low."

Brown said the nation's pool of manpower in the 18-25 age group available for military service has dwindled to 1,300,000. He said he was giving the information in Washington last week and had authority from "high Washington sources" to make it public.

"The situation shows that actually in terms of last-ditch fighting manpower we have less than 5,000,000 World War II veterans standing as the last bulwark between our national security and national disaster in event of any emergency," Brown said.

Mock Air War Clashes With Law In Washington

SPOKANE, May 6.—(AP)—Secrecy surrounding the Pacific Northwest "air war" maneuvers was back in force today after the veil was lifted briefly yesterday by a justice of the peace who didn't think the war games constituted a "secret emergency."

Justice John J. Aiken told drivers of nine trucks carrying 50,000 gallons of jet fuel to Spokane air force base that the maneuvers didn't justify them in disregarding Washington State Highway regulations.

He applied the remarks also to Army officers he said accompanied the drivers to a bond hearing, telling them he thought a "secret emergency" they declined to discuss was nothing more than the maneuvers.

The drivers, hauling the fuel for a commercial firm in California on a contract basis, bought \$1200 worth of Washington licenses and posted \$225 in bonds before they went on their way.

They were arrested by the Washington State Patrol. A variety of charges against them included failure to carry California or Washington license and towing more trailer units behind their trucks than is permitted in Washington.

Payroll Records Of 33 Oregon Counties Broken During 1947

Thirty-three out of Oregon's 36 counties established new payroll records in 1947 and nearly all set new employment marks during the year, according to tabulations of 16,000 employers' reports just completed by the State Unemployment Compensation Commission.

The \$852,089,522 paid last year to an average of 301,508 workers represented a gain of 20.2 per cent over 1946 and 7 per cent over the previous high in 1944, while it is more than double any pre-war figure.

Multnomah County's \$411 million payroll fell short of the 1943-4 figures when 96,000 were busy in the shipyards, while Gilliam and Sherman fell slightly short of 1946 wage totals. At certain periods of 1947 covered employment in Marion, Morrow and Walloa also was less than a year before, but their wage bill was considerably higher.

The downstate share of all pay rolls rose considerably, both from pre-war and war-time figures. In 1940 the 35 counties outside the metropolitan district paid out 46.7 per cent of the state total, in 1944 it was 51.7 percent and last year reached 51.7 percent.

Douglas Gain Noted
Most striking gain was shown by the timber belt counties of Linn, Lane, Douglas, Coos, Josephine and Jackson, which reported \$175,854,113 in pay rolls last year against \$86,117,384 in 1944 and \$34,205,029 in 1940. Their proportion of the state's wages nearly doubled in the past three years.

Dairy farmer R. A. Pierson, who had claimed a world production record for the beer-loving Friesian, said Garsdon Minnie gave an officially recorded yield of 1984 pounds in 24 hours. Bridge Birch's mark was 1551 pounds for 24 hours, one day last May when she was drinking a quart of stout daily.

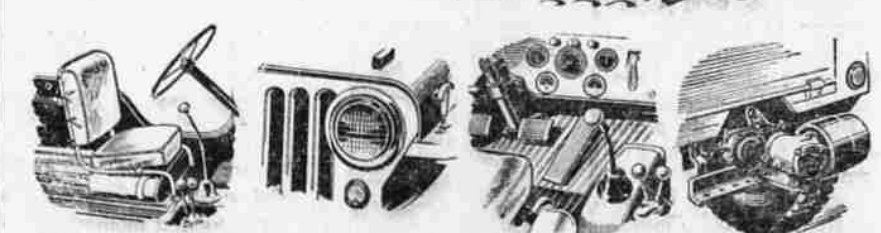
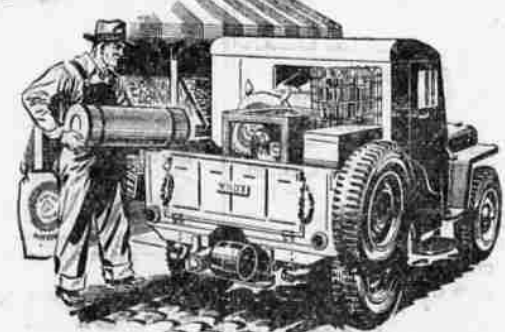
