**Guerrier Lumber Mill At Springfield Burns**

SPRINGFIELD, Ore., May 7. (AP)—The C. W. Guerrier Lumber mill was almost completely destroyed by a \$100,000 fire here last night. The mill is owned by the M. and M. Woodworking firm of Portland and employs 83 men. No cause was given for the blaze, whipped by a brisk wind. The mill burned out in 1943 and since was rebuilt. Destroyed were the main sawmill and the planing mill. Saved were the fuel bins, part of the loading dock and the lumber.
