Lemon Supplants Feller as Top Star Of Cleveland Team

Associated Press Sports Writer Bob Lemon is forcing Bobby Feller to take a back seat in the Cleveland wigwam. The converted infielder-outfielder with three wins in four starts tops Rapid Robert in wins, complete games and even in strikeouts.

Last night Lemon shut out Washington with four hits, 8-0, to lift the Tribe into second place, a half game behind Philadelphia. While Lemon has been writing his own success story, Feller has been knocked out of the box in his last two starts. Before that he threw a two-hit shutout and ran a string of 17 consecutive scoreless innings.

In addition to his pitching, Lemon is hitting .533 with eight hits in 15 at bat, including two home runs.

The Roseburg Umpqua Chiefs, with one win and one defeat to date, play hosts to Central Point here Sunday at 2 p. m. on Finlay field. Other games on the roster in Southern Oregon League play will see Tri-City at Klamath Falls, Grants Pass at Ashland, Central Point Stude at Grants Pass against the Old Timers, and Medford at Crescent City.

Grants Pass Merchants and the Central Point Stude are on top of the league with two straight victories, the Merchants having beaten Roseburg, 9-5, last Sunday and the Stude beating Crescent City, 6-3, on the Medford High School field. Klamath Falls also made the win column, defeating Grants Pass Oldtimers, 19-4, in a game reported to have lasted over three hours last Sunday. Central Point's game at Tri-City was rained out and the Medford Crater-Ashland game postponed.

Roseburg Manager Doug Taitt has been scouting around this week for a new pitcher to work against Central Point, but has not yet announced whether he found one.

Ezzard Charles Kayos Ray in Ninth Round

CHICAGO, May 8.—(AP)—Ezzard Charles, ranking challenger for Gus Lesnevich's light-heavyweight title, knocked out Elmer (Violent) Ray in the ninth round of their scheduled 10-round battle. The Ohioan, outweighted 17 pounds, floored Ray two minutes and 43 seconds after the round opened.

Charles weighed 175 pounds to 192 for his opponent.

The bout was the first professional match in Chicago Stadium since Sam Baroudi, Akron, O., lightweight, died without regaining consciousness six hours after being knocked out by Charles last February.

Charles pledged \$5,000 of his purse to Baroudi's parents while

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the promoters also donated another \$5,000.
