

Stars Twice Drub Angelenos; Seals, Beavers Divide

The Hollywood Stars took two from the Los Angeles Angels yesterday, and they really hurt. Los Angeles, in relinquishing the doubleheader, dropped to two full

games behind the San Francisco Seals.

San Francisco dropped the opener of its doubleheader with Portland, 7 to 4, but came back for an 11 to 2 windup and finished the series with six wins in seven tries. Perez, who couldn't win for Hollywood, racked up another one for the Seals and helped his cause by socking in two runs. Melton was tagged for the loss in the first game when Dibiasi, although giving 12 hits, was aided by four double plays.

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Chiefs Drop Ball Game to Millers of Central Point

Baseball fans saw a fine pitcher's duel Sunday as the Central Point Millers beat the Umpqua Chiefs, 6 to 2, in a fast baseball game at Finlay Field. Whidden, hurling for the Millers, gave up only four hits, two of them in the last inning, while Richardson, Myrtle Creek high school moundman last season, pitching for Roseburg, yielded six hits, three of them being bunched for four runs in the third inning.

The Chiefs scored in the third when Richardson doubled to left, went to third on Hill's infield out, and raced home when Reinking, Central Point shortstop, muffed Lovell Baker's hot grounder. Roseburg's final score came in the last inning, after two were out, when Cummings lashed a triple into deep left and scored on Von Baker's Texas leaguer into right.

Central Point took the lead with an unearned run in the second inning when Bruzza was safe on an error and scored on a second misplay after two were out. Richardson ran into a flock of trouble in the third. Reinking was out, short to first, as the lead off batter, O'Connor drew a walk and advanced as Malone grounded out to Cummings. Bruzza cracked a double into deep right, O'Connor being held at third. Chandler was purposely walked to fill the bases. Norby singled, scoring O'Connor and Bruzza, and Knapp then whacked a triple to put Chandler and Norby across the plate. Riddle ended the inning with a grounder to Baker at third. The Millers added another tally in the fourth, Whidden getting a single to start the inning. He was sacrificed to second by Reinking's neat bunt in front of the plate, and scored on Malone's single into right.

Gaining confidence as the game advanced, Richardson allowed only one hit, a double by Reinking in the sixth, and permitted no runs to score. He was relieved for a pinch hitter in the last of the eighth and Roy Long went into the box for the final frame, being nicked by Bruzza for a single.

Roseburg Indians Drop 2 Games To Medford Tornado

Medford's Black Tornado swept a doubleheader with the Roseburg Indians at Medford Friday, Cheez out-hurling Chuck Scofield, 5-1, in the first game and Malone beating Reitman, 5-3, in the second.

In the first game Medford broke the ice in the fourth inning when Holzgang, Fasel and McKinney singled and Deuser doubled into left field for three runs. They added two more in the fifth when Scofield issued his only walk of the game and Holzgang, Fasel and Donahoe followed with singles.

Cheez had a no-hitter up until the sixth inning, when Glen Scofield and Leo Bowers both singled, Roseburg could not score until the seventh inning, however, when Wissing reached first after the catcher dropped a third strike. On an attempted pick-off play at first Donahoe threw the ball into right field, Wissing advancing to second. Cheez then hit Coen with a wild pitch. Wissing scored when Holzgang, Medford's third sacker, threw Edgar's slow roller over the first baseman's head.

Leo Bowers and Glen Scofield were the only Roseburg men to get hits. Fasel led Medford with 3 singles in 3 trips to the plate.

Story of Second Game
In the second game Roseburg scored first in the third inning, when Cornutt led off with a single. Reitman dropped a bunt down the first base line which Cheez booted, Cornutt scoring on the play.

Medford tied up the game in the last of the third after two outs. Richmond walked, stole second and third and then stole home, barely sliding in under Reitman's throw.

The Tornado went ahead in the fourth with Fasel getting a life at first base on Bower's miscue at third. This was followed by a fly out to Rauschert in left field, sandwiched between singles by Donahoe and McKinney.

Roseburg tied up the score in the sixth when Malone hit Coen on the elbow, sending him to first base. Edgar followed with a double, Coen going to third. Chuck Scofield singled, scoring Coen and Edgar.

Medford put the game on ice in the sixth. Fasel led off with a single. Coach George Erickson sent Tom Johnson into the game, replacing Reitman. Fasel stole second and went to third on a balk by Johnson. After Donahoe had lifted a fly ball for the first out, Cheez hit a hard ground ball to Cornutt at short, who made a beautiful throw to Sanders at home to catch Fasel by a step.

With two down, McKinney doubled to score Cheez and then scored himself on Deuser's single.

Stan Cornutt paced the Indians with two singles in three trips to the plate. Harold Edgar with a double and Chuck Scofield with a single were the other Roseburg hitters. McKinney led Medford with a single and double in three times at bat.

Dried Eggs Made to Taste Like Something to Eat
DENVER. (AP)—Former service men won't believe this, but two professors at the University of Denver claim to have perfected a system which makes dried eggs taste like something to eat.

Dr. Ralph M. Conrad and Dr. John W. Greene, said in an interview that this is how they do it:

"The 'off tastes' (understatement) are removed by treating the powdered eggs with an acid. The acid is then neutralized with bicarbonate of soda. Then the eggs are packed in vacuum cans, the same kind of cans tennis-ball manufacturers have been using for years.

Lowly Athletics Battle Cleveland For League Lead

This is kindly old Connie Mack's 86th year—his 64th in baseball—and it promises to be one of his happiest.

The venerable manager of the patched-up Philadelphia Athletics, who has experienced innumerable thrills in his 48 seasons as boss of the same crew, must be having the time of his life watching his "east-of-crow" make monkeys of the so-called elite of the American League.

Only a mathematical oddity keeps this much-abused outfit from occupying first place in the American League. After yesterday's double victory over the Detroit Tigers, 10-5 and 5-3, which boosted their winning streak to eight games, the Athletics actually lead the first place Cleveland Indians by a half game.

Indians Trim Red Sox
Cleveland had two triumphs over the Red Sox in Boston, 4-1 and 9-5.

The Indians surprised the Red Sox by coming from behind twice to capture their doubleheader. Trailing 1-0 on Ted Williams' fourth inning home run, the Indians drew even in the next stanza when Keltner connected for the first of his three home runs. Keltner's second four-base knock came in the 10th inning and sparked a three-run rally.

Williams' second home run of the day and seventh of the season gave the Red Sox a brief 5-2 lead in the second game, but the Indians came back with three round trippers to win.

Cardinals Top League
The St. Louis Cardinals moved into first place in the National League. They pushed a half game ahead of the New York Giants by downing the Boston Braves, 6-4, while the Cubs were shutting out the Giants, 2-0, in Chicago.

Washington turned back the St. Louis Browns, 3-1, to move into fourth place in the American League.

The third place Pittsburgh Pirates remained a game off the pace in the National League by dividing a doubleheader with the Brooklyn Dodgers. The Dodgers won the opener, 14-2. Kiner swatted his fourth and fifth round trippers to lead the Pirates to a 10-3 nightcap decision.

The Philadelphia Phils clubbed the Reds twice in Cincinnati, 14-2 and 8-0.

Jones Butts Way To Victory Over Hart in Mat Tilt

Rufus "Puddin' Head" Jones, powerful Negro headbutt specialist, lived up to his name and effectively battered Frankie Hart's cranium, as the two fought it out on the mat, to take the third and deciding fall Saturday night in the Armory.

The two wrestlers, Hart groggy from Jones' butting and Rufus appearing equally groggy, from Hart's rights and lefts to the jaw, receded about the ring most of the final seven minutes, 10 seconds, required by Jones for the fall.

Referee Elton Owen himself came in for a bit of the head whacking as he attempted to pull the Negro off Hart after Jones repeatedly put Hart down by pulling his hair and using other foul tactics. Owen at one time tried to give Hart the bout on a foul, but the latter preferred to battle it out.

Jones took the first fall with a Boston crab after laying Hart out with a series of head-butts, in 17 minutes. The popular Frankie came back to take the second fall in eight minutes with a damaging leg twist, after flooring the Negro with a series of lying

shoulder butts and Sonnenbergs.

A couple of times in the final round of the rough and tumble tussle it appeared that Hart would successfully apply his leg twist, but Jones usually broke the hold by yanking Hart's hair or getting the latter's head close enough to apply his favorite butting tactics.

Hessell, Kiser Draw
Gordon Hessell and Jack Kiser wrestled to a 30-minute draw in the semi-final bout. Kiser pinned Hessell's shoulders to the mat with a "skin-the-cat" after 15 minutes of the first round. Hessell came back to even the count after eight and a half minutes, pinning Kiser's shoulders follow-

ing a flying head scissors. Neither could take a fall in the remaining six minutes. Referee Owen had to part them once when both wrestlers got locked in a "cradle."

Gust Johnson took the only fall of the 20-minute preliminary, beating Sergeant Kennerton with a surfboard, following a series of headlocks and a body slam after 12 minutes.
