

Israeli Reject Bernadotte's Peace Proposals, Prepare For Renewal of War With Arabs

CAIRO, July 6.—(AP)—Israel today formally rejected Count Folke Bernadotte's Palestine peace proposals. Neither Arabs nor Jews gave a definite reply on the United Nations mediator's bid for an extension of the Holy Land truce.

Israeli Foreign Minister Shertok handed Bernadotte a 1,000-word reply to the mediator's proposal to turn Jerusalem over to Arab rule, make Haifa a free port and regulate immigration.

The reply said Israeli leaders were deeply wounded by the Jerusalem proposal. The Jews expressed emphatic opposition to any restriction on immigration, and urged Bernadotte to reconsider his whole approach to the program. This latter was taken as an indication that the Jews are willing to extend the truce if new talks develop. The truce expires Friday.

In Cairo an Egyptian cabinet source said there is little doubt the Arabs will resume fighting in Palestine when the four-week truce ends Friday, despite U. N. appeals for an extension.

Emerging from a three-hour conference of the Arab League's political committee, Secretary General Azzam Pasha reported no decision was reached on the truce extension proposal.

Jews Digging In
In Jerusalem, where Arabs and Jews engaged in gun duels Sunday and again yesterday, Israeli forces have begun digging in for an all-out resumption of war.

During Sunday's shooting in the Holy City an American marine, Edward Brodeur of Webster, Mass., caught a glass splinter in the eye when a bullet struck the windshield of his Jeep. An Associated Press correspondent who returned to Tel Aviv from Jerusalem last night said the sniping and shell fire in the city was the heaviest since the truce began.

Celebration At Yoncalla Success In Every Phase

YONCALLA — Crowds estimated at 3,000 people gathered here Sunday for the second annual rodeo sponsored by the Yoncalla Saddle Club. Cars began arriving in town early in the morning and by 10 o'clock many spectators had arrived at the baseball diamond for the first event of the day.

The game between the Taylor Tribe and the Yoncalla baseball club was very close. The Taylor Tribe scored three runs in the first inning. Yoncalla then scored two runs in the third inning and continued in the lead until the eighth, when the score was 8 to 5. The Tribe scored four runs in the ninth, winning the game by 9 to 8.

After lunch, a colorful parade marched down the town's main street from the schoolhouse to the rodeo park. Leading the parade was the queen's float with Reta Kruse and her court: Ida Miller, Myrna DeMeritt, Barbara Maupin and Esther Metzger, all attired in rodeo costumes.

Saddle clubs from Cottage Grove to Myrtle Creek also took part. There were groups of gaily dressed riders mounted on beautiful horses. The Cottage Grove American Legion Band provided music. Boy Scouts marched in the parade, while exhibition drills were executed by the Yoncalla Baton Drill Team—20 grade school girls in high white boots, white shirts and blouses.

Rodeo Successful
With ideal weather and a slight breeze, the rodeo was a success. There were cowboy contestants from all parts of the county who gave the show a professional quality. Les Freshell of Canyonville was the announcer. Everett Telkamp of Drain was arena director, and, with Walt Mask of Roseburg, furnishing the livestock. The antics of "Brownie" Thorpe of Canyonville, the clown, and his horse, Silver Queen, amused the crowd.

The comedy rodeo queen and her princesses led the grand entry. Riding around the arena were members of the Yoncalla Saddle Club, Cottage Grove Riding Club, Trail Dust Saddle Club of Roseburg, Timber Line Trail Riders of Sutherlin, and the Myrtle Creek Saddle Pals.

With the large number of contestants — 76 for the 10 main events — the rodeo continued until late afternoon. The saddle-borne riding event was cancelled and the entry fee and purse distributed among those who were to have contested. Winners in other events were:

Calf Roping: Dick Jones, 24.5 seconds, first place; Jack Monahan, 30 seconds, second; Wesley Wilson, 33.8 seconds, third.

Steer Roping: Keith Lippert, 28 seconds, first place; Jack Monahan, 35.5 seconds, second; Wesley Wilson, 38.5 seconds, third.

Wild Cow Milking: Howard Prohl, 22.5 seconds, first place; Elmer Shagard, 23.5 seconds, second; Johnny DeWitt, 24 seconds, third.

Barrel Race: Bruce Hiding, Warren Wilson, first place; B. Parlin, second; Bill Hiding, third.

Saddle Horse Race: Ed Parker, 18.7 seconds, first place; George Meyer, second place; Ed Shagard, third place.
