Musial Boosts Batting Percentage to .410

NEW YORK, July 7.—(AP)—Four members of the National League's starting all-stars headed by the mighty Stan Musial were among the loop's first ten hitters today. Three others in the big ten were selected by the fans to the second team.

Musial, the league's leading batter with remarkable .410, gained five points during the week to take a 59-point lead over Richie Ashburn, Philadelphia's Philly rookie centerfielder, who enjoyed a comfortable second place lead over Tommy Holmes, Boston, A.S.B., through games of Monday, July 5, owned a .351 average compared to Holmes' .337.

Andy Patko, the Cub's brilliant third baseman was fourth with .332. Ed Waitkus, Chicago, raised his mark to .322 to take over fifth place.

Joost drove in two important runs, one with a home run which opened the game. It marked the fourth time this season that the deft leadoff hitter had opened a game with a home run.

Brissie, was tagged for 11 hits, but struck out nine and pitched out of several tight spots to record his eighth victory. He now leads all American League pitchers in the knockout department with 77 whiffs to his credit.

Ted Williams Sags In Batting Streak

CHICAGO, July 7.—(AP)—Ted Williams, the Boston Red Sox slugger, has proved to be only human after all. He has hit a batting slump, just like the other guys, but he still is far ahead in the American League hitting race with .386.

Williams cooled off with only five blows in 29 trips last week—his poorest showing since his sizzling pace into the 400's. He plunged from a breath-taking .415 percentage to the respectable .386—a nose dive of 29 points.

Lou Boudreau, Cleveland shortstop-manager, was 26 points behind with .360 in a v-e-g-e-s through Monday's games. Al Zarilla of St. Louis was third with .342 followed by Bobby Brown, New York, .324, and Luke Appling, Chicago, .319.

Williams stayed ahead in two specialized brackets—runs-batted-in with 72 and hits with 85. Zarilla passed him up in the two-bagger production with 20. Ken Keltner of Cleveland regained the lead in home run output with 19 to replace Joe DiMaggio.

Philadelphia's Dick Fowler headed the pitching percentage with .61 for .857. Cleveland's Bob Lemon led in strikeouts with 72.

All-Star Baseball Game's Lineups Chosen by Fans

CHICAGO, July 7.—(AP)—Starting lineups, chosen by fans in a three-week poll for the all-star baseball game in St. Louis next Tuesday, includes players from six National and five American League clubs.

A record of 4,107,863 fans returned their selections during the balloting which ended at midnight Monday. The poll, conducted by the Chicago Tribune and 452 other newspapers and radio stations, showed Ted Williams of the Boston Red Sox as the greatest individual vote-getter with a total of 1,556,784. Stan Musial of the St. Louis Cardinals was second with 1,532,502, and Joe DiMaggio of the New York Yankees, the 1947 leader, third with 1,519,182.

The lineup choices are for every position except pitcher. The rival managers, Bucky Harris of the Yankees and Leo Durocher of the Brooklyn Dodgers, will name their own mound staffs. But the pilots must use the fans' lineups for at least the first three innings of the game.

The two managers also will pick the remainder of the 25-player squads. They are expected to follow closely the fan voting at the various positions.

CLEVELAND, July 7.—(AP)—The Cleveland Indians today announced the signing of Leroy (Satchel) Paige, recognized as one of the "greats" in Negro baseball.

Tribe manager Lou Boudreau did not disclose whether he intended to use the hurler in relief or starting roles, but said he would be in uniform tonight.

A tall, slim righthander, Paige has been with the Kansas City Monarchs for about six years. Tribe president Bill Veeck said he was signed after "we had searched the country over for a capable pitcher."

The Indians last year brought the first Negro player to the American League when they signed Larry Doby.

A native of Mobile, Ala., Paige has been with the Baltimore Black Sox, the Chicago American Giants, the Pittsburgh Crawfords and the House of David.

His record in strikeouts for a single game is 18—the same as Bobby Feller's major league mark—set in 1932 when he was pitching for the Monarchs against the Baltimore Black Sox in the Yankee Stadium.
