Pre-Truce Palestine Air Attack Causes Many Casualties

Big Power Resources Key To Future Industrial Growth Of Northwest, Official Says

The Pacific Northwest has unlimited power resources which will be tapped at some future date to bring about greater industrial development than is generally realized, Daniel L. Goldy, asserted Thursday while on official business in Roseburg. Mr. Goldy, from the Office of the Secretary, Department of the Interior, Washington, D. C., conferred in Roseburg with J. E. Slattery, Bureau of Land Management supervisor for the Roseburg area, relative to various problems of sustained-yield management of O. & C. timber lands.

The Department of the Interior, Goldy said, is greatly interested in the power possibilities of the Pacific Northwest, particularly in view of the growing shortages of oil and coal.

In addition to hydroelectric power, he stated, the Northwest can produce huge quantities of power through underground gasification of coal deposits. The Department of the Interior, Goldy said, is conducting extensive experiments with controlled burning of coal deposits underground. By forcing oxygen and steam into burning deposits, gas of uniform high quality can be extracted and may be piped, where needed for use as fuel.

The Northwest, he states, has vast coal deposits which are not suitable for mining, but which can be converted into gas. He is particularly interested in the coal resource of Coos County as a possibility of large-scale power development.

Working on Details
Mr. Goldy, who worked with G. Girard Davidson, assistant secretary, Department of the Interior, in establishing the sustained-yield program of forest management recently announced by the department, has been assigned to the task of assisting the district office in working out details. He is investigating the size of cooperative units from the standpoint of economy, determining the timber supply requirements most suited

to promoting fullest utilization through secondary manufacture. He also is making a study of standards to be required of sustained-yield cooperators, together with other factors entering into the proposed new policy.
