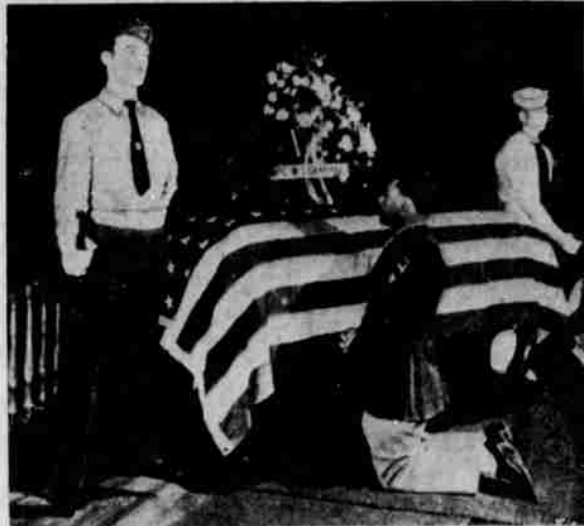

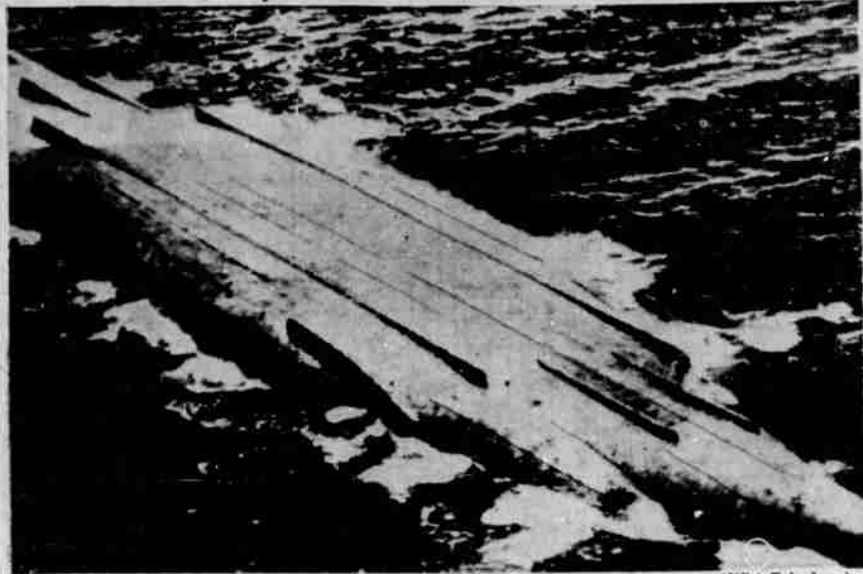

Deserted and defenseless, the obsolete battleship USS New York expires for the first time her vulnerable under-hull, just moments before she slid to the bottom of the Pacific. The gallant veteran, flagship at surrender of German Grand Fleet in 1917 and scourge of Okinawa Coast by 1945, sank after 8 1/2 hours of pounding by ships and aircraft of the Pacific Fleet and USAP fighter-bombers 45 miles southwest of Pearl Harbor. 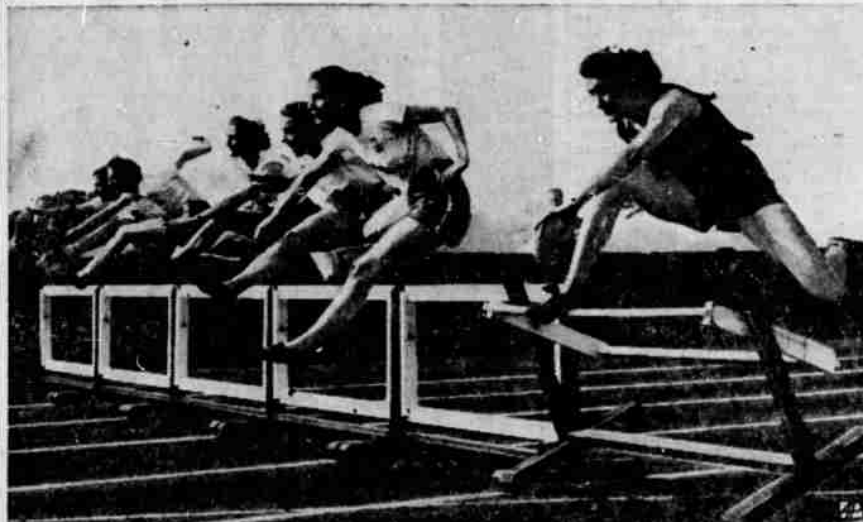

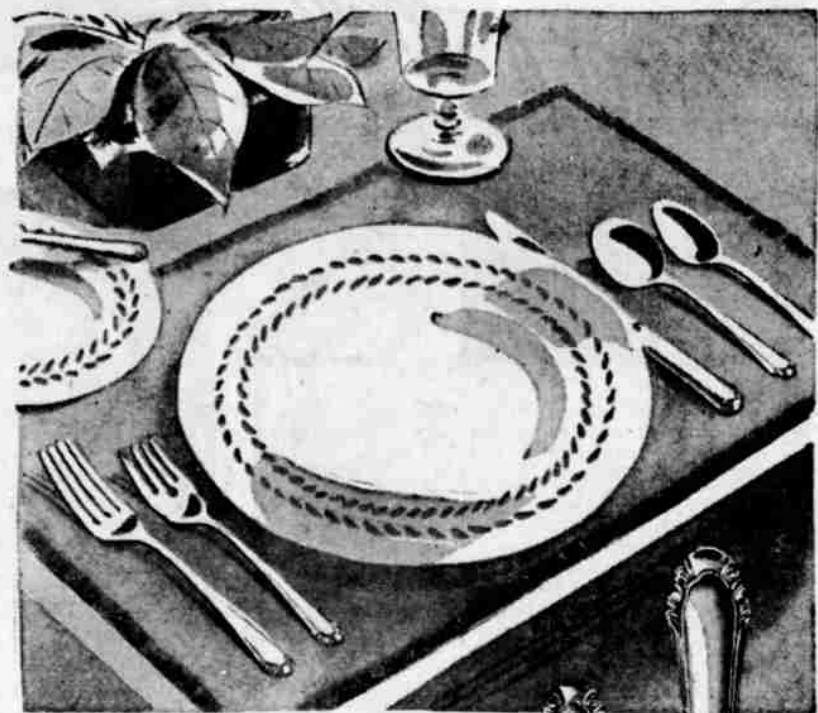

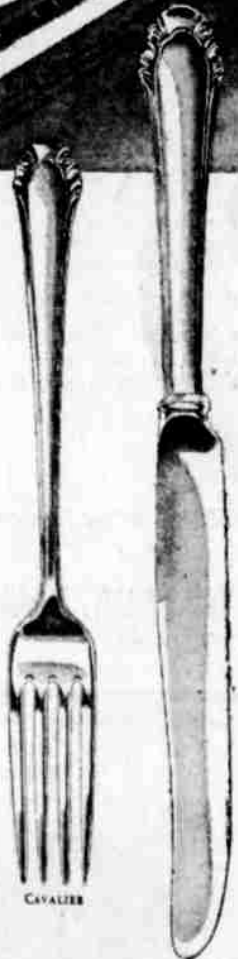
