

### Colored Troupe Will Entertain At Vets Hospital

"Jive Jamboree" is the title to a fast-paced, all-Negro variety revue which plays at the veterans hospital Thursday afternoon and evening for the entertainment of the patients. It was announced today. This show is one of a series of the Veterans Hospital Camp Shows, successor to USO Camp Shows, to be provided for the patients in all veterans hospitals throughout the United States.

The show which includes dancing, comedy, rhythm, singing and instrumental numbers, is paced by the Herbie Cowen Trio, who give music that is different but delightful. Jean Prater at the piano displays her talents in individual numbers as well as accompaniments. A vocal quartet, known as The Ebony Tones, present snappy tunes and deep-south spirituals that have made them famous all over the country. Alston & Young sing, dance and play in a melody and rhythm act. Alberta Hunter, known as the "sepia Sophie Tucker," is a blues singer whose record of "Down Hearted Blues" sung to the accompaniment of the Louis Armstrong orchestra sold a million copies. The Three Poms are bundles of energy who whirl through a routine of spins, bends and tap dancing. The show is concluded with Holmes & Jean doing a soft shoe dance that ends up in acrobatics. These performances are given in the recreation

hall at the veterans hospital at regular intervals for the entertainment of the patients.

### Sandy River Will Get \$220,000 Fish Hatchery

PORTLAND, July 15.—(AP)—A Sandy River fish hatchery to cost \$220,000 is planned by the State Fish Commission. Preliminary construction plans for the project are to start at once. The commission said the hatchery will be designed to handle 10,000,000 Salmon eggs annually. Clearance work on the Clatskanie River, to open 15 miles of new spawning grounds, is also due to get started with \$160,000 of federal funds.

### Oregon Adventists Open Annual Camp Meeting

PORTLAND, July 15.—(AP)—The annual state-wide camp meeting of the Seventh-Day Adventist Church opened yesterday in Gladstone Park, with about 6,000 church members expected. Elder Lloyd E. Biggs, Portland, state president, reported the receipts from Oregon's 12,048 Adventists totalled \$1,781,950 during the last two years, and mission offerings \$833,500—an average of \$229 from each church member. The camp meetings, which usually draw a crowd of 12,000 over the weekends, will continue to July 25.

### This Collector's On the Button

SEATTLE—(AP)—H. C. Glickert is a specialist in the "button-eye view" of presidential campaign history.

His hobby is collecting presidential campaign lapel buttons. While others wait for political speeches, he waits for campaign buttons. "There should be some mighty interesting new buttons coming out," he says.

From previous campaigns he has almost 2,000. He collected more than 20 during this year's pre-convention campaigning.

His oldest is a faded tintype worn by Stephen A. Douglas supporters when Douglas ran against Abraham Lincoln in 1860. Large pins and ribbons were the order of the McKinley-Bryant era, but the buttons really reached their hey-day, says Glickert, in the Roosevelt-Willkie campaign of 1940.

"That's when bitter sarcasm in slogans became prevalent and people forgot many of the political niceties, if any," he said. He said about 600 different types of pins were issued during that campaign and he got about half of them.

Glickert, 55, a former quarantine officer with the city health department, gets his pins from friends and by swapping with collectors throughout the country.

### Austrians Closely Checked by Soviet

VIENNA—(AP)—A high Austrian government source says Russian military authorities have made increasingly stiff demands upon local civil authorities in their zone of occupation for detailed reports on almost every phase of public life in certain sections.

Although Russian troops had been removed from some of the areas nearly two years ago, Russian officers recently approached local Austrian officials with verbal orders to list all former Nazis and all foreigners residing in the area, to report on all political parties and their activities and to report three days in advance on all public meetings to be held—even traditional religious processions.

The Russian officers also asked for complete local police rosters and demanded that any changes in personnel be reported immediately. They wanted lists of all hotels, including details as to their capacity and the names of their owners. Post offices were told to submit lists of newspapers coming into the area and the number of each distributed. All lectures and speeches by public officials had to be reported verbatim and they also demanded that each political party secretary give detailed account of the activities of his party on 10th and 20th of each month. And local officials were told to turn over lists of all trucks and other vehicles, all garages and names of their owners.

### Gov. Warren to Attend Oregon's Centennial

SALEM, Ore., July 15.—(AP)—Governor Earl Warren of California, Republican vice-presidential candidate, has accepted an invitation to attend the Oregon Territory Centennial August 13 and 14, Gov. John H. Hall announced.

Governor Warren will be guest of honor August 13 on "Governor Warren Day" at Oregon City, which will be the center of the celebration on that day.

On August 14, Governor Warren will speak at the States dinner in Portland, at which governors of the five states which originally were a part of Oregon Territory will be honor guests. The territory included Oregon, Washington, Idaho, and parts of Montana and Wyoming.
