Miss Jeannie Buick, Roseburg Resident 72 Years, Passes

Funeral services will be held at 2 p. m. Tuesday at the Long and Orr Mortuary for Miss H. Jeannie Buick, 88, who died Saturday at 244 S. Pine St., where she made her home with her brother-in-law and sister, Mr. and Mrs. George Sewell.

She was born July 15, 1863, in San Jose, Calif., the daughter of D. S. K. and Janet (Brown) Buick. Her parents were both natives of Scotland. Her father, who joined the California gold rush in 1849, brought the family to Oregon in 1872, moved to Myrtle Creek in 1876, and 10 years later came to Roseburg, where he became publisher of the Roseburg Plaindealer.

The family spent two years in Germany when Mr. Buick served as consul to Germany under President Harrison. Upon returning to Roseburg, Mr. Buick opened the town's first real estate office.

Miss Buick made her home continuously in Roseburg, except for a short time spent with a brother in California.

She was a member of a family of nine children, seven sons and two daughters. Mrs. Kate Sewell, Roseburg, is the only one of the nine children surviving. Miss Buick also leaves a sister-in-law, Mrs. Charles Buick, Myrtle Creek; four nephews, Frank H. Buick, Redding, Calif.; H. Arthur Buick, Salt Lake City, Utah; K. O. Buick, Klamath Falls; David Buick, Miami, Florida; and two nieces, Mrs. Louis Pfau, Pasadena, California and Mrs. F. W. Poorman, Salem.

Miss Buick was a life-long member of the Presbyterian Church and also was active in the work of the Eastern Star and Rebekah lodges, and the Roseburg Woman's Club.

The funeral services will be conducted by Dr. Morris H. Roach. The body will lie in state at the mortuary Tuesday forenoon.

Yellen, in 40 years of song-writing, has produced such favorites as "I Wonder What's Become of Sally," "Ain't She Sweet?" and "Happy Days Are Here Again."

It was the latter that was picked up by the Democrats and used as a campaign song for the late Franklin Delano Roosevelt's first successful bid for the presidency.

Yellen said he gave a copy of the new song to Ed Jaekle of Buffalo, one of Dewey's campaign managers to be used royalty-free by the Republican Campaign Committee. The music was composed by Sammy Lain.

The lyrics of the song, published with Yellen's permission, are: They're asking lots of questions On the radio each night, And giving lots of prizes To the ones who guess 'em right.

Well, folks, we've got a question—The nation's greatest quiz—The prize you'll get Is the biggest yet.

Are you ready? Here it is: (Chorus) Do we want Dewey? Yes, Sir. And do you? Do we need Dewey? Like the flowers need the dew.

'Cause there isn't any hokey About this fellow Tom E. Dewey. Do we want Dewey? I'll say we do.
