The big fish took out about 150 feet of line before he attempted to give up. He was landed after a 30-minute battle. In addition to the seven caught, three fish were hooked and lost, said Miller. Also, nearly a dozen flounders were bagged. Miller said the bass have been running in the bay about a month, and that he and a party had made a good catch the week before. In his party that weekend was Beverly Nichols, employed at the Veterans Hospital, who hooked a 25-pounder almost on the first cast. It was her first time to land a big one.

U. S. Jet-Propelled Fighter Planes Going Overseas

LONDON, July 21. (AP)—The deputy U. S. consul in Glasgow said yesterday the American aircraft carrier Sicily will land 75 jet propelled Shooting Star fighters in Scotland Aug. 4, to bolster American fighter strength in Germany.

The U. S. air force in Wiesbaden, Germany, confirmed this, as did sources in London who refused to be quoted by name.

An American official in Germany commented: "We are very happy to have them." He said the jets comprised a full group of fighters, adding that he did not know how long they would remain in Europe.

The British Press Association, reporting the jets would be landed on the river Clyde from the Sicily, said the jets made up the 36th fighter wing of the U. S. Air Force, and had been stationed in Panama.

The report came only a few days after 60 American Superfortresses arrived at Royal Air Force bases here on what has been described officially as a training mission.

Social Security Eligibles Urged To File Promptly
 Individuals who have been employed in jobs covered by the Social Security Act and who attain the age of 65 are urged to visit the Social Security Administration immediately in order to file application for monthly benefits which may be payable to them under the provisions of the old-age and survivors insurance law.

Survivors of deceased wage earners should also contact the Social Security Administration as soon as possible after the wage earner's death to claim any benefits that may be due.

Barriers to Public Use Of Atomic Power Listed
 SEATTLE, July 20. — (AP)—One of the nation's top nuclear physicists said today that public use of atomic power is now a "matter of development."

"Science has solved its problems," said Dr. Felix Bloch, Stanford University scientist here for a series of lectures to advanced physics classes at the University of Washington.

He listed the problems of organization, politics and finance as barriers to productive employment of the atom.

Active Convention Chooses Officers
 CALGARY, July 19. — (AP)—Dr. Charles Benson of Omak, Wash., was elected by acclamation as international president of the Active Club at final session of the organization's four-day convention Saturday.

In England of Calgary, was elected second vice-president.

Dr. Benson was the Canadian and United States representative of the council of Young Men's Service Clubs held in Hastings, England, last May.

Other candidates elected to international office were: Mervin Viter, Eugene, Ore., first vice-president; and Howard Miles, Spokane, Wash., executive secretary. Mr. Benson succeeds Robert L. Moore, Jr., of Sacramento, Calif.

Foreign Aid Costs Exceed Outlay For Schools and Police
 WASHINGTON, July 21. — (AP)—Foreign aid is costing Americans more this year than the total outlay for schools, police and fire protection and similar local services.

Paul G. Hoffman, who is directing the European Recovery Program, made this assertion in a radio address to be beamed to Europe by the World Wide Broadcasting Foundation.

The economic cooperation administration, striking back anew at Communist criticism of the aid venture, declared:

"No Communist claim has been more ridiculous than the charge that we are dumping surpluses on Europe."

Then, detailing the "sacrifices" he said Americans are making, Hoffman added:

"Foreign aid is costing the United States six billion dollars this year. This is more than the amount spent by all the cities, towns and villages in the United States for fire protection, police schools, sanitation, parks and similar local services."

Congress set aside \$5,055,000,000 for the European recovery phase of the program.
