**Church, Military Rites Held For Eli A. DuMont**

The remains of Eli Abraham DuMont, 29, killed in action July 20, 1944, on Blak Island in the South Pacific, arrived in Roseburg last night, accompanied by Staff Sgt. August Belmont. The body was met by members of the American Legion Umpqua Post No. 16 and escorted with military honors to the Roseburg Funeral Home.

He was born July 11, 1915, in Grand Ronde, and moved to Glide with his parents when a small child. He was a member of the Roseburg National Guard and was one of the first to go overseas. He enlisted in 1940 serving in Co. D, 162 Infantry and in the 1st Division, known as the famous Sunset Division. He was a member of the Catholic Church. Surviving are his mother, Mrs. Esther LaBonte, Glide; six sisters: Mrs. Josephine Schloppe, Salem; Mrs. Pauline Lombay, Boring; Mrs. Marie Schloppe, Glide; Mrs. Rosette Dale, Boring; Mrs. Esther LaBonte, San Pedro, Calif.; Mrs. Betty Daniels, Boring; two brothers: Lester and Floyd, both of Glide.

Graveside services will be held in the Catholic Cemetery Thursday, July 22, at 10 a. m., with Father Sebastian Ward officiating, and with military honors by the American Legion and Co. D, 162 Infantry.

At the train when it arrived at 12:46 a. m. today were Irv Brunn and George Jackson, color bearers, and Harold Lentz, Jim Young, Joe Quant, George Trapalis, Erwin Short, Roy O. Young and Ted Post, who were the honor guard and will serve as pall bearers. A firing squad from the original Company D, with which DuMont served, will give the salute over the grave.

**Mother of Roseburg Resident Passes Away**

Jennie Lovena Crowley, 63, mother of Delmer Crowley, Roseburg, died at Cheshire, Ore., July 9, according to information received here. She was born in Anston, Wash., Feb. 11, 1885. Surviving are her husband, Walter L. Crowley, Cheshire; four daughters, Mrs. Elsie Starr, Willits, Cal.; Mrs. Maude Bagwell, Oakland, Cal.; Mrs. Martha Collett, Salt Lake City, Utah, and Mrs. Pearl Ferguson, Eugene; two sons, Delmer of Roseburg, and James of Junction City, Ore.; son Jack L. Crowley, was killed at Okinawa during World War II. She is also survived by seven grandchildren. Funeral services were held Tuesday July 13, in Junction City.

**Fire Destroys High School at Vancouver**

VANCOUVER, Wash., July 21.—A fire destroyed most of Ogden Meadows High School today, and left the school board with the problem of where to educate more than 600 students next fall.

The fire, of undetermined cause, broke out between 3 and 4 a. m. and swept through 24 classrooms, the cafeteria and kitchen, offices, home economics room, and machine shop.

The gymnasium and several rooms in the rick north wing were saved. A few other rooms may be partly salvagable. The building was appraised at \$200,800. It was a var-built structure and anticipated a fall enrollment of 650 students—including Vanport flood evacuees who have moved here.
