

Four Northwest Doctors to Treat Ailina Eskimos

WASHINGTON, July 20.—(AP)—Four Oregon and Washington physicians will spend August in Alaska treating ailing Eskimos, Aleuts and Indians, Secretary of the Interior Krug says.

They will visit Alaska native service hospitals at Sitka, Juneau, Tanana, Bethel and Kakanak and will go to many outlying villages where medical services is not available.

Members of the party are Dr. John E. Tuhy, tuberculosis specialist, leader of the team, and Dr. W. Charles Martin, ophthalmologist, both of Portland, and Dr. Frank Douglas, pediatrician, and Dr. David Law, dentist from Seattle.

Law will introduce the use of fluoride among the natives for treatment of tooth decay.

The other doctors will diagnose, treat and, when necessary, perform emergency surgery.

An American Medical Association team of physicians surveyed the medical needs of Alaska's natives last year.

This year's team will be a service rather than a survey group, Krug said.

Rep. Hill Wants Income Tax Cut

SALEM, Ore., July 22.—(AP)—State Rep. Earl Hill, veteran Lane County representative and one of the legislature's influential tax committee members, said here today he wants a good-sized personal income tax reduction in the 1949 session.

He said he also wants half of the income tax surplus, which

will be \$50,000,000 when the legislature meets, to be put aside for future use.

Hill said the legislature would be besieged with demands by groups wanting the surplus money, but he added the legislature should resist such demands unless such groups can demonstrate a real need for funds.

He would an income tax reduction would benefit thousands of citizens who are finding it hard to make ends meet, and that a reduction wouldn't harm the state, either.
