Third Party Ticket Wins Listing on Ohio Ballot

COLUMBUS, O., July 23.—(AP)—The Ohio Supreme Court ruled yesterday that the Henry A. Wallace Third Party ticket could go on the state's election ballots next November.

Secretary of State Edward J. Hummel had declined to put the Third Party ticket on the presidential ballot in Ohio on two grounds:

1. That Ohio election laws contained no provision for the nomination of independent candidates for president and vice-president, and
2. That Wallace supporters had

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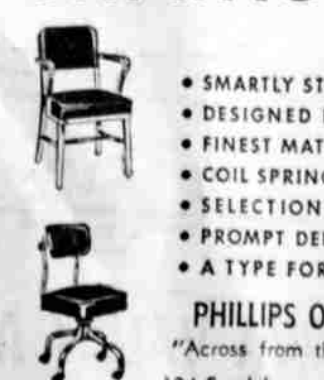
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
