Russia Taking Great Risks Because European Conquest Plans Bog Down

The greatest danger of war between Russia and the democracies lies in the fact that her European conquest has bogged down and she is taking risks in desperate efforts to get the Red machine rolling again.

The inhuman food blockade of Western Berlin is one of those risks. The blockade must be broken by the Allies—but the consensus of observers is that this isn't the time to use force, as some rather impetuous folk are advocating. Therefore it is encouraging to hear General Lucius D. Clay, U. S. military governor in Germany, deny published reports that his headquarters had recommended forcing an armed convoy through the blockade.

Such Allied action surely would result in armed conflict. Obviously there is danger of war, but as things stand there seem to be ways of dealing with the situation without resorting to arms. Concerted action by the Democracies in clamping politico-economic sanctions on Russia should turn the trick. With this in mind the strategy of the Western Allies seems to be developing along the line of applying sanctions and then holding firmly on the front which the Bolsheviks have reached through central Europe. In so doing the Democracies would be adopting the ruse employed by Hercules in defeating the Lybian wrestler Antaeus, whom none ever had overthrown because he was a son of Mother

Two More Bodies Found in Ruins of Vanport

PORTLAND, July 26.—Vanport, the city shattered by 15 feet of water eight weeks ago, gave up its 12th and 13th bodies last night.

One was identified as Mrs. Camella Dawley, 60, and the other was believed to be her semi-invalid sister, Gerda Wennerlund, 65. Thirteen more persons are still missing from the Memorial Day flood disaster.

Salvage crews, slowly clearing paths through the housing project city that held 18,700 persons until the flood, came across the bodies. Tangled wreckage still bars some areas, and salvage is far from complete. Water has been draining off for weeks, but some still stands in Vanport streets.

Extra Hours Set For Reinstatement Of GI Insurance

To help veterans reinstate their GI insurance before the deadline Saturday night, July 31, the contact office of the Veterans Administration will remain open on that date from 9 a. m. to 5:30 p. m.

Clifford C. Fields, VA representative in this area, reported that all of the agency's offices in Oregon would accept reinstatements Saturday, July 31, which is normally a closed day. For the rest of this week, ex-GIs with lapsed term insurance may put any amount back in force—from \$1,000 to \$10,000—by certifying that their health is as good as it was when the policy lapsed.

After the July 31 deadline, veterans whose insurance has been lapsed for three months or more will have to pass a physical examination to regain their policies.

The VA office in Roseburg, located at the Veterans Hospital, has the needed blanks.
