Congressmen Talk of Quitting Within Two Weeks

WASHINGTON, July 28.—(AP)—Senator Robertson (R-Wyo.) said yesterday that Gov. Thomas E. Dewey, GOP presidential candidate, had advised Republican congressional leaders "to stay around a week or so and then go home."

Robertson told reporters that Senator Taft carried the Dewey message to a closed-door meeting of the Senate Republican policy committee.

They came out as Speaker Martin and other House GOP leaders arrived to discuss special session plans with Senate chieftans.

A third Republican, Senator Hawkes (N. J.), said a definite decision on adjournment will probably be reached today.

House Republicans also talked about a two-week session.

One-Vote Primary Win Upheld by Supreme Court

SALEM, Ore., July 28.—(AP)—H. R. Jones lost his Supreme Court appeal yesterday in his suit contesting the nomination of John R. Steelhammer as Republican candidate for the State House of Representatives from Marion county.

Supporters of Jones brought suit in circuit court, where it was dismissed. The State Supreme Court heard arguments in the case yesterday and then dismissed Jones' appeal.

Both Jones and Steelhammer are Salem residents, and are former state representatives.

The official election total showed Steelhammer the winner by a single vote. Jones claimed there was an error in a Salem precinct, and that the outcome actually was a tie. He wanted the votes recounted in that precinct.
