Tito Big Enough to Defy Moscow, But How Long Can He Hold Out?

One of the outstanding puzzles of the moment revolves about the ultimate fate of Yugoslavia's dynamic Red dictator, Marshal Tito, who is in Moscow's very bad graces.

It's a month now since the powerful Bolshevik Cominform went to the extreme of publicly denouncing Tito's leadership of his country and declaring that unless he bowed to the Moscow line he must get out. A month is a long, long time for a Communist to keep going after Moscow has turned thumbs down and given the nod to the head-man.

Still Tito not only hangs on but seems stronger than ever with his followers. Why? That query struggles on the crook of a question mark like a fish on a hook. Has this Tito—who is adored by his followers but is labeled a villain by many of the outside world—just been lucky in thus far evading punishment by Moscow, or are we witnessing the emergence of another of those outstanding dictators who have made history in the past couple of generations?

Probably Moscow is trying to figure that out, too, for Tito's defiance of the Soviet dictatorship is close to unique among top-leaders of the Red world revolution. This is the first break in the solidarity of the Communist slave states of eastern Europe—a break which could work irreparable damage to Russia's drive to Communize the entire continent.

How Long Can He Last
Tito's response to Moscow's edict amounted to open defiance. He expressed deep affection for comrade Stalin and swore to follow the party lines—but by both word and deed he has made it clear that he is the big boss in Yugoslavia—and his influence reaches into neighboring states. Ample support for this stand has been given during the current meeting of the Yugoslav Communist Party, whose delegates

listened to an eight-hour opening speech of defense and defiance by Tito and cheered themselves hoarse.

It looks as though the Cominform holds that Tito has committed the unpardonable sin of poking his head up too high. That's a dangerous game to play with Moscow, and he isn't likely to get away with it unless, as remarked before, he is another of those rare personalities who possess supreme leadership.

Tito isn't going to give up his dictatorship without a struggle, however, and he is tough.

Tito acquired his Communism in World War I and inflicted it on Yugoslavia during the second global conflict. Now we wait to see whether his stature is great enough so that he can defy Moscow and get away with it.
