Yugoslav Queen Victim Of Jewels Theft In Britain

LONDON, July 29.—(AP)—Scotland Yard reported yesterday the theft of jewelry valued at about \$4,000 from the home of Queen Marie of Yugoslavia. Burglars entered her apartment in Chelsea by forcing a door, the announcement said. Queen Marie, mother of ex-King Peter, came to England in 1940. She has been studying sculpting in Chelsea, London's artist colony.

Leslie Little One Of War Prisoners Mistreated by Japs

Leslie Little, 547 South Stephens, Roseburg, is one of the 14 named prisoners of the Japanese, as well as numerous unnamed prisoners, from the Tokyo Area Prisoner-of-War Camp 5-B, Niigata, Honshu, who were beaten and mistreated, according to information received from the Legal Section of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Tokyo, Japan.

Convicted of the brutal beating and mistreatment of allied prisoners of war, two more Japanese were sentenced to five year terms of imprisonment at hard labor by a Yokohama Eighth Army Military Commission July 16. Tried under charges and specifications signed by Alva C. Carpenter, chief of the legal section, Tsunee Abe and Seiji Sakai (known also as Kiyilo Nose) were found guilty of beating and mistreating a total of 14 named, as well as numerous unnamed prisoners.

Both accused were civilians connected with the Rinko Coal Yard, where prisoners from Tokyo Area Prisoner of War Camp 5-B, were forced to work. Abe served as a work party guard from September 1944 until September 1945, while Sakai, nicknamed "The Nigger" by the prisoners, was a job boss from October 1944 until August 1945.

Testifying at the trial were three former prisoners of the Japanese at the Niigata Camp. All told of beatings and mistreatment they had experienced or witnessed. Sgt. Robert R. Wolfe, Denver, Colo., stated Abe had charge of taking work details from the camp to the coal yards, taking over this duty in 1944 from a civilian guard who has previously been sentenced to 40 years imprisonment for mistreating prisoners. The prisoners described occasions on which Abe beat prisoners with a Kendo stick and kicked them when they had fallen on the ground.

In describing Sakai's actions, one affiant stated, "He seemed to go out of his way to make it hard on us and on the least pretext,

he would slap anyone until they fell down. If you were sick and weak and couldn't work hard, then he would be continually at you."

City Manager Rule At Salem Opposed by Labor

SALEM, Ore., July 29.—(AP)—A movement to abolish Salem's city manager form of government, which has been in effect only 18 months, was underway today. A committee, headed by labor organizations, was attempting to get such a proposal on the general election ballot next November. The proposal would abolish the city manager form, and substitute the commission form of government.

Blonde 'Spy' Who Tipped Off Reds Identified

NEW YORK, July 29.—(AP)—The blonde "spy" whose tip led to indictment of a Communist party official was identified yesterday as Elizabeth T. Bentley, New York newspapers carried

her name and said she was the woman who has been subpoenaed to testify in secret before the House Committee on Un-American Activities investigating "espionage activities in the government."

Her address was not revealed but she was described as a secretary-stenographer in a New York business house.

The World Telegram quoted her as saying "I am not enthusiastic about the publicity I shall now receive but, just as I went to

the FBI and later appeared before the grand jury, I will now cooperate with the committee and any other American agencies which feel I can be of service."

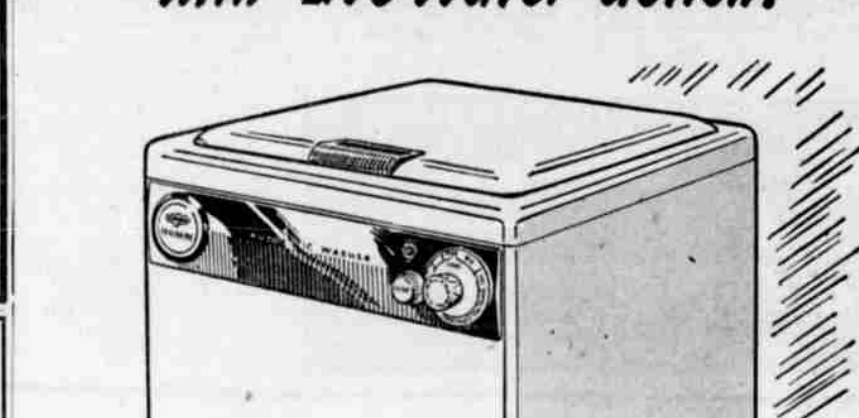
