

American Athletes Lead in Opening Olympic Games

OLYMPIC STADIUM, Wembley, England, July 30.—(AP)—Uncle Sam's basketball crew led off with an easy victory as expected today as competition in six sports began in the Olympic Games.

Coach Bud Browning's cagers conquered Switzerland, 86 to 21. In the first round of the preliminaries (although Bob Kurland of the Phillips (Okl.) Oilers fouled out.

Three high jumpers from the United States led off the first track and field competition by qualifying for the finals, scheduled this afternoon.

George Stanch of the University of California at Los Angeles and Dwight Edleman of the University of Illinois cleared the qualifying height of 5 feet 1 5/8 inches easily, but Vern McGrew of Rice Institute barely squeaked through on his last jump.

The round-robin preliminaries in basketball opened with 17 spectators and a charwoman on hand for the opener in which a small squad from the Philippines trounced Iraq, 102 to 30.

Bruce Harlan of Ohio State established a substantial lead over a field of 26 others today after completion of the first four compulsory dives in the men's springboard championship.

The American ace scored 52.28 at the outset of the spring board event which will be completed Saturday after the completion of ten fancy dives by each Olympic contestant.

Information to Guide Anglers, Vacationists

Sports and Weather Outlook

The coming weekend will be favorable to nearly all outdoor sports. Fishing is sure to be good on the coastal rivers. Not because I have it on authority, but because the authorities are all down there fishing.

The clam digging will not be very good until later in the week, beginning about Tuesday morning.

The forecast is for partly cloudy skies inland; a high fog along the coast with possible showers in the Cascades.

Roads will be dry, but drive carefully and enjoy another weekend.

(Time calculations given above are based on a 24-hour clock. Time begins with midnight. Hours beginning with zero are a.m. Subtracting 12 from time shown in four digits will give p.m. clock time.)

Tide Corrections From time and height listed above for Bandon Beach, corrections may be made for other coastal points as follows:

- Umpqua River entrance—add 10 minutes, add 1 foot.
- Reedsport—add 1:25 hours, subtract 4 foot.
- Coos Bay entrance—same time, add 2 foot.
- Coos Bay (city)—add 1:35 hours, add 5 foot.
- Siuslaw River entrance—add 15 minutes, add 1 foot.
- Waldport, Alsea Bay—add 35 minutes, add 8 foot.
- Newport, Yaquina Bay—add 5

minutes, add 1.1 foot. Brookings, Chetco Cove—subtract 25 minutes, add 1 foot. Port Orford—subtract 20 minutes, add 4 foot.

In using these tables of tide predictions it must be borne in mind that they give the times and heights of high and low waters and not the times of turning of the current, or slack water. For stations on the outer coast there is little difference between the time of high and low water and the beginning of the ebb and flood current. But low places in narrow channels, landlocked harbors or tidal rivers the time of slack water may differ by several hours from the time of high or low water stand.
