London Police Bag Nine Raiders At Airport Treasury

LONDON, July 30.—(AP)—A van load of men who attempted a raid on a warehouse at the London airport were captured yesterday after fighting a pitched battle with police.

Nine policemen were injured. Nine men were charged with breaking and entering a bonded warehouse.

The warehouse is used to store gold and other valuables. It was not learned what it contained at the time of the raid. Airport officials said they did not think any gold was there. In a similar raid at Orly airfield in Paris early in July, \$327,000 in gold was taken.

Tipped off that the raid was planned, 40 flying squad officers surrounded the building and were on guard when the lorry drove up.

Passengers sitting in planes on runways watched the struggle. The combatants used bottles, wrenches and crowbars. London police do not carry arms.

The British Press Association said it is understood the warehouse contained about \$30,000,000 worth of diamonds and about \$8,000,000 worth of gold.
