From California they will tour Yellowstone and other national parks, and stop in Chicago, Wisconsin and New York. Miss Bushey plans to return to her home the first of September.

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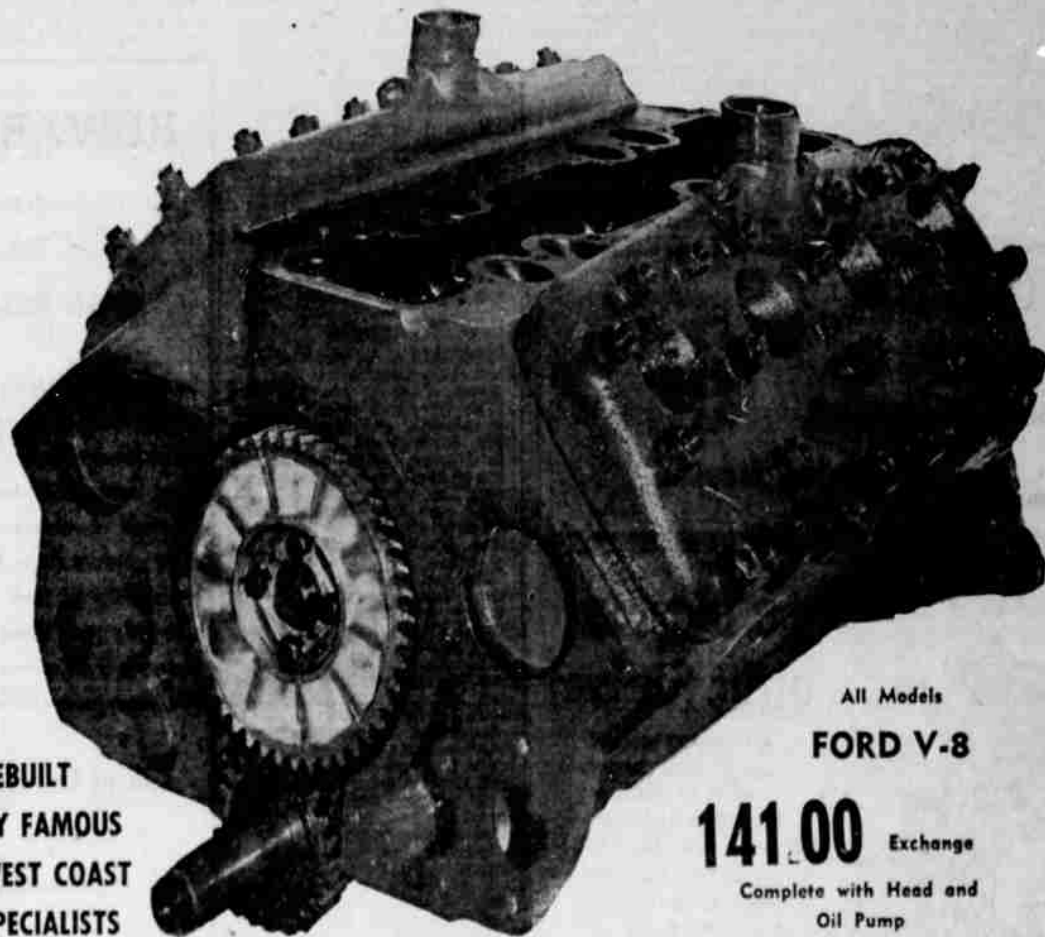
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
