

Truman, Dewey Blasted at Reds' National Meeting

NEW YORK, Aug. 3.—(AP)—American Communists jammed into Madison Square Garden last night for a noisy, demonstrative national convention of their own—highlighted by censure of both the Democrats and Republicans and praise for both Russia and Henry A. Wallace.

Speakers at the opening session of the convention, the first to be held by the group since 1945, were high party chieftains, all of whom are under federal indictment on charges of advocating the overthrow of the U. S. government by violence and force.

William Z. Foster, national chairman of the party in this country and the top leader of the group of 12 arrested two weeks ago on grand jury charges, was the convention keynote.

He told the estimated 20,000 persons in a fiery speech that bristled with attacks on "fascist, Wall street imperialists," that a vote for either President Truman or Gov. Thomas E. Dewey, Republican presidential candidate, "means a vote for eventual fascist or war."

Of Wallace, the Progressive party's presidential candidate, Foster said that his group "offers the opportunity for the forces fighting for peace and against inflation and fascism, to organize and express their strength."

Foster's endorsement of the Wallace group is expected to be followed by a formal decision of the Communist executive board not to nominate a presidential candidate of its own.

Foster described both Truman and Dewey as "brazen liars who charge that the Communist party is trying to dominate the new party or to claim the credit for its formation."

It was announced that the convention had received messages of support of the American Communist movement from Communist parties in several foreign nations, including Bulgaria, Italy and Czechoslovakia.

He said he had renounced Communism in 1937 because he had become convinced it is a "form of totalitarianism, that its triumph means slavery to men wherever they fall under its sway, and an spiritual threat to the human mind and soul."

The witness said the purpose of the underground group he knew was "not primarily espionage" at the time he was acquainted with its operations.

Rather, he said, it was "infiltration" of the government.

After he broke with communism, Chambers said he lived in hiding for a year, "sleeping by day and watching through the night, with gun or revolver within easy reach."

He said that since he had been in the Communist underground, "I had sound reason for supposing the Communists might try to kill me."

Probers Face Barrier Remington is an official in the Office of International Trade. He was named by Miss Elizabeth T. Bentley, confessed Communist spy ring courier, as one of the government workers she said turned secret data over to her during the war.

The committee's request for Remington's employment record was sent to the White House because President Truman has forbidden government agencies to give out any information on "loyalty" checks on government workers.

"The record is clear that the committee has tried to get the employment records of Mr. Remington," Ferguson said.

"It looked last Friday as if the secretary of commerce would be able to turn them to us. He has been called this morning and he is unable to give an answer as to whether he can or cannot turn them over to us. . . .

"We will proceed under this handicap."

Ferguson emphasized that the committee was not asking for "what they call loyalty checks" on Remington, but for the names of people who approved his employment and transfers.

Remington was waiting to testify when Ferguson discussed the failure to get this data.

Remington testified last Saturday that he never gave Miss Bentley any information not available to news reporters. She had said he gave her secret data during the war on American plane production.

(Continued From Page One) We learned during the last war that lumber can't be produced in unlimited quantities without access to timber lands. Yet we are doing nothing to make our timber more available even though war again threatens.

Pointing out that an aircraft carrier costs approximately \$250,000,000, Watts declared that the access road program is far more important to national defense than a single carrier, but that the \$250,000,000 required to build one such fighting machine would finance construction of virtually the entire access road system.

While the Chief Forester was engaged in general inspection of forest operations, Dr. Hall conducted investigations into the character of cut timber left by loggers as a part of his study of utilization processes. Preliminary investigation indicates, he said, that virtually all of the cut logs, including dry timber, could be profitably used in manufacture of paper pulp, alcohol, molasses, and other products.
