Wife Murderer Draws Life Imprisonment

KELSO, Wash., Aug. 6 (AP)—Howard Bozarth, 45, a Woodland cook, yesterday pleaded guilty to second degree murder of his wife, Osfield Bozarth.
Superior Court Judge J. E. Stone, who accepted the plea after Bozarth had pleaded not guilty to murder in the first degree, immediately sentenced him to a maximum of life imprisonment.

After hearing a scathing denunciation by the judge, Bozarth was led weeping from the courtroom. It was the first trace of emotion he had shown since the brutally beaten body of his wife was discovered at their Green Mountain home July 27.
Bozarth had maintained he awoke from a drunken stupor to discover his wife, dead and knew nothing of the foregoing events.

Human Behavior Clues Sought In Study of Animals

NEW YORK, Aug. 6 (AP)—Four university psychologists are busy on a new research project—in the Bronx Zoo.
Obtained for the job by the New York Zoological Society, the psychologists expect to find out such things as:
Whether humming birds prefer red flowers.
Why the gorilla beats his chest.
Why sea lions hate to have their offspring learn to swim.
The research team believes their study will help uncover some of the secrets of the evolution of intelligence.
Each day, they go through a complicated process of matching wits with the beasts.
The experiments include such procedures as testing whether a chimpanzee can choose a string with a grape on the other end of it; whether an elephant can remember that an apple is tied to a string that terminates under a piece of black paper instead of white paper.
Two of the psychologists—Dr.

Bernard Riess, assistant professor at Hunter College, and Samuel B. Lyerly, instructor at the University of North Carolina—sleep in the zoo at night.

Traffic Mishap Leads To Embezzler's Capture

TOLEDO, O., Aug. 5 (AP)—A minor traffic accident in downtown Toledo today led to the capture of a fugitive who Police Lieut. William Fisk said confessed he is wanted in Everett, Wash., for embezzling \$3,100 from a state auto license bureau.
Brought to police headquarters for a routine check of his driver's license and registration, the man, Howard F. Cann, 28, of Everett, asked permission to use the washroom. He climbed out and escaped but was captured a few minutes later in his hotel room.
Lieutenant Fisk said he admitted he was wanted in Everett from where he fled in 1946. But he said, he took only \$400. Cann joined a carnival in Youngstown, O., a week ago as a cook.
