Feller Defeats Yanks but Shows Declining Form

Bobby Feller, the Cleveland Indians' "Mr. X," continues to be as much of a puzzle as ever to baseball fans.

Although he pitched the Tribe to an important 9-7 victory, over the New York Yankees last night to give the pace-setting Indians a half game advantage over the Philadelphia Athletics, the famous pitcher demonstrated that he was not the great Feller of former days.

Outside of the fact that Feller, for the sixth straight time, failed to go the distance, everything broke wonderfully for the Indians.

They gained a full game over each of the three chief contenders as the Athletics were beaten by the Browns in St. Louis, 2-1, and the Boston Red Sox were nipped by the White Sox in Chicago, 4-3.

And they not only ended the Yankees' five-game winning streak, but extended their own to six in a row. A pair of ex-Yankees, Joe Gordon and Allie Clark, were the sparkplugs of the victory. Gordon collected three hits and a walk in four times at bat, scored four runs and batted in three with his 21st home run. Clark got a single and home run, his round tripper tying the game at 3-3 after the Yankees had opened

up a 3-0 bulge in two innings. Despite the A's loss, they held second place over the Yankees by four-tenths of a percentage point. Boston remained in fourth place, half a game behind the third-place Yankees and one and a half lengths off the pace.

Young Ted Gray, making his first big league start, pitched the Detroit Tigers to a 1-0 10-inning victory over Masterson and the Washington Senators.

The St. Louis Cardinals, Brooklyn Dodgers and New York Giants each gained ground as the National League-leading Boston Braves dropped their fifth game in their last six starts, losing to the cellar-dwelling Chicago Cubs, 5-4. The second-place Dodgers defeated the Cincinnati Reds, 4-1. The Cards topped the Philadelphia Phils, 6-2, and the Giants nipped the Pittsburgh Pirates, 7-4.

Brooklyn advanced to within three and a half games of the Braves when young Rex Barney shackled the Reds with three singles. The Cardinals also moved up to within three and a half games of the top. The fourth-place Giants climbed to four and a half games off the pace, staying off a final rally to nose out the Pirates.

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California, Washington Crews Win at Olympiad

HENLEY-ON-THAMES, England, Aug. 9.—(P)—Two mighty crews from the Pacific Coast—University of California's eight-oar shell and University of Washington's four-with-coxswain—rowed to Olympic championships today on the Thames.

The Californians beat out Great Britain and Norway to retain the title held by the United States since the regatta was started in 1920.

The eight-oar shell's time was 5 minutes, 56.7 seconds for the

abbreviated 1,900 meter course—fastest of the regatta. Washington's four-oar crew with coxswain defeated Switzerland and Denmark in the first race for America's other championship.

Yale University's four-without-coxswain finished third behind Italy and Denmark in the finals.
