

De Facto Govt. of South Korea Gets United States OK

WASHINGTON, Aug. 13 (AP)—United States yesterday extended "de facto" recognition to the American-sponsored government of South Korea.

De facto recognition means that the U. S. acknowledges that the government is in fact the ruling regime in the country.

The State Department in a statement said the anti-communist government formed in South Korea as a result of the May 10th elections "is entitled to be regarded as the government of Korea envisaged by the General Assembly's resolution of November 14, 1947."

The Department announced John J. Muccio of Rhode Island has been named by President Truman as special representative to Korea with personal rank of ambassador.

The State Department recognition in effect formally sets up a separate government for the approximately 21,000,000 Korean people in the American zone south of the 38th parallel. Russian

troops control the northern part with its 9,000,000 population. A pro-communist government is being organized there.

Full-fledged, legal so-called "de jure" recognition will come after the United Nations General Assembly acts on the report of the eight-nation commission it appointed to supervise the election, government officials said. Pending this UN meeting in September, the "de facto" recognition means the State Department is giving the same recognition without the full legal frills.

The State Department announcement comes but three days before the August 15 celebration scheduled in Korea to celebrate the third anniversary of the Korean deliverance from Japanese rule which began in 1910.

Weather in July Listed Very Mild

Four Draft Rules Are Announced By Defense Secretary

WASHINGTON, Aug. 13 (AP)—It's too late to volunteer for military service after a draft notice has been delivered.

That's one of four peacetime draft rules announced by Secretary of Defense Forrestal. The others:

1. Registrants who pass a pre-induction physical examination will be called no sooner than three weeks from that date—so they can settle personal affairs—and within 120 days—to make sure that the examination still holds good. If 120 days passes without call, they get another examination.

2. Those physicals will be given under current Army regulations, with assignment to duty

according to physical ability. A general classification test will determine mental capacity. Minimum score: 70.

3. Wherever possible, the inductee will be given a chance to name the branch of service he wants.

Forrestal said the armed forces will continue to accept voluntary enlistments, except for men

who already have received notice to report for pre-induction examinations.

The Army will handle both the induction program and the volunteer enlistments.

TACOMA, Aug. 12 (AP)—Ten local retail stores remained closed and no developments were reported in the dispute between store members of the Industrial Conference Board and the Retail Clerks' Union, local 367, AFL.

Wage increase negotiations were broken off Monday when pickets appeared at two large downtown department stores. Eight other retail stores closed Tuesday.

No labor-management meetings are scheduled, according to Les Sherman, spokesman for the management.

The stoppage has idled some 750 clerks.

PORTLAND, Aug. 12 (AP)—A coroner's jury has cleared City Policeman Ross Buzzell of blame in the death of his young wife when his gun discharged while he tried to halt a tavern brawl.

The parents of the girl, Mr. and Mrs. Carl J. Clemens, who

were in the tavern, testified the gun discharged when Buzzell was jostled by assailants. The bullet from the police revolver pierced the 22-year-old mother's skull.

Immediately after the hearing an assault and battery complaint was served on Keith N. Matheny, 24, one of four men held after the Aug. 1 incident.
