Many wage earners who have reached the age of 65 are of the opinion that it is necessary to retire permanently in order to qualify for retirement benefits under the old-age and survivors insurance program.

Paul F. Johnson, manager of the Eugene office of the Social Security Administration, stressed the fact that retirement benefits may be paid to qualified workers for any month in which he does not earn more than \$14.99 in employment covered by the Social Security Act.

Babe Ruth, Baseball's Greatest Hero, Passes

When word of Ruth's death was received, former President Herbert Hoover said at his suite at the Waldorf-Astoria Hotel that the Babe was "one of the great sportsmen of the United States."

Gov. Thomas E. Dewey said in a statement at Albany that "George Herman Ruth was the idol of millions of sports-loving Americans. A spectacular baseball player whose equal may never be reached, Babe Ruth was above all a great American."

Gov. Dewey and his wife sent a message of condolence to the Ruth home.

Major radio networks planned memorial services for Ruth on nationwide special programs tonight. The programs included: Mutual—7 to 7:30 p. m. (EST), 5 to 5:30 (Pacific Daylight Time).

Follow-Up Plan Aids Vets With T-B Affliction

About 1,000 Oregon veterans suffering from tuberculosis are benefiting from a follow-up program, carried on primarily for discharged patients through the Veterans Administration's regional medical center.

In describing this work, Clifford Fields, VA representative for this area, pointed out that one out of ten of the afflicted ex-servicemen was being treated by private doctors under the agency's "home town" plan.

"When a patient leaves the hospital, he is advised to report frequently for checkups, for x-rays, fluoroscopic examinations, sputum tests and also possible treatment," Fields said.

"This is aimed at guiding recovery and discovering relapses so that treatment can be resumed quickly. It also helps to safeguard others from the spread of communicable T. B."

Known sufferers who neglect this service are contacted in person by VA social workers and urged to take the precautions.

At the Portland outpatient center, the VA is furnishing 150 pneumothorax treatments a month, Fields said. All veterans examined for any reason are given routine chest x-rays, and are advised by letter if abnormalities are found.

Similar outpatients care also is being provided to many veterans with non-service connected illness by state and county public health centers, he added.

are a "red herring" intended to hide Congressional failure to act on his anti-inflation program.

But Thomas said the question of Communism can't be dismissed by red herring charges, "even if they come from the President of the United States."

Thomas said the committee expects to "bring into full focus" the operations of "still another espionage ring," when it resumed hearings Sept. 7.

He would not go into details, but there are reports it will deal with alleged efforts by foreign powers to get American industrial secrets.

Thomas would not comment on the reported row within the committee. It seems that a solemn promise not to talk was exacted from everyone present when Alger Hiss, former State Department official, testified at a closed-door session yesterday. Yet morning papers published many details of what went on.

They were George Milligan, Medford, Ore., his wife and daughter, en route home from Glendale, Calif.

Milligan said the plane was forced down by fuel pump trouble. He picked out a meadow for the forced landing, but the ship was badly damaged.

Canada-U.S. Pact Anniversary Feted

OGDENSBURG, N. Y., Aug. 17 (AP)—Canada's defense minister, Brooke Claxton, today hailed the 1940 Ogdenburg agreement on joint North American defense as the turning point in the recent war.

Both he and Defense Secretary James Forrestal of the United States spoke at ceremonies that commemorated the historic decision of the late President Roosevelt and Prime Minister Mackenzie King by dedication of a plaque of friendship.

Claxton said it was probably "the first occasion when two ministers of defense, not ministers of war, mind you, have met together on an unarmed frontier to rededicate their nations to the great cause of mutual peace."

Thousands crowded into this St. Lawrence river city from neighboring Prescott, Ont., and elsewhere on the eighth anniversary of an agreement that has been extended into peacetime on a permanent basis.

Chief Baird said blood was found on both Moser's and White's clothing.

Both Lived At One Address White was arrested early Saturday morning at Cass and Stephens streets by City Patrolmen Lloyd Larsen and Charles Long. His address is given as 627 Mill St., where Moffitt also resided. White had returned Thursday from a brief trip to California. He has been a Roseburg resident since 1931 or 1932.

economic and political freedom."

"Even if such controls were solutions," Millikin continued, "The administration of them could not be entrusted to the present executive department."

Mr. Truman said Congress said "no" to his program, but had no program of its own, he added.

"They made excuses and called names and argued about who was to blame for inflation, but they did nothing effective to control it."

"They passed a bill limited to one subject only—credit controls—which is but a tiny fraction of what we need. Then the Congress went home."

The law allows tightened controls on bank credit and a return to controls, such as were imposed during the war, over installment buying.

None of these controls can be put into effect until 30 days from today—the date the measure was signed.
