Negro Ends Resistance To 'Jim Crow Draft Law'

NEW YORK, Aug. 19.—(AP)—Philip Randolph, Negro Union leader, yesterday announced abandonment of his campaign for non-compliance with what he termed the "Jim Crow draft law."

In a joint statement issued in behalf of himself and Grant Reynolds, Randolph said the decision to abandon the civil disobedience movement against the draft was based on belief that President Truman "intends to enforce his announced plan to end military segregation."

Effectiveness Of Truman's Attacks Subject of Dispute

WASHINGTON, Aug. 18.—(AP)—Senator Murray (D-Mont.) contended today that President Truman is making political hay with his attacks on congress, but Senator Watkins (R-Utah) promptly disputed this.

In a running argument that won't be settled until the Nov. 2 election, Murray told a reporter all the signs point to public approval—particularly in the West—of the criticisms that Mr. Truman has leveled at Congress.

"From the mail I'm getting," the Montana senator said, "the people think the president is right in making an issue of Congress' failure to do anything about the high cost of living. They are cheering him on."

But Watkins had another story. He said the only people in his state who are impressed by Mr. Truman's statements "are those who would be for him anyway."

"Most of the people realize that you can't stop inflation by passing a law," Watkins said. "They know that some sacrifices are in order if we are going to continue to help keep the world on its feet. They don't think Truman is competent to handle the big job that is ahead and that's

Maj. R. D. Bridges On Active Duty At Embarkation Port

SEATTLE, Port of Embarkation, Wash., Aug. 18 (Special)—Major Rolyn D. Bridges, Oakland merchant and broker, is one of 35 Oregon reserve officers completing two weeks of active duty with the Army Transportation Corps at the strategic Seattle Port of Embarkation with the 422 Traffic Regulation group, commanded by Col. Thomas F. Gunn, Grants Pass. Major Bridges was attached to the troop movement division during his stay here.

In World War I Major Bridges served as a company officer with the 361st Infantry and in World War II as provost marshal of the Portland port of embarkation; later a transport commander in the South Pacific. He is prominent in the reserve, having been president of the Umpqua chapter of the Reserve Officer's Association after World War I and again after the last war. At the present time he is on the executive committee of the ROA in Oregon.

The 422nd Traffic Regulation group is the main outlet for Alaska for army personnel and supply and serves a large volume for the port, especially Japan. Its primary purpose is to conduct the movement to and from these overseas areas of military forces, dependents, government employees and ever needed supplies. The port ranks third among those now used by the Army in connection with its far flung activity in foreign lands.
