

Top Grid Elevens Clash Tonight In Annual Pageant

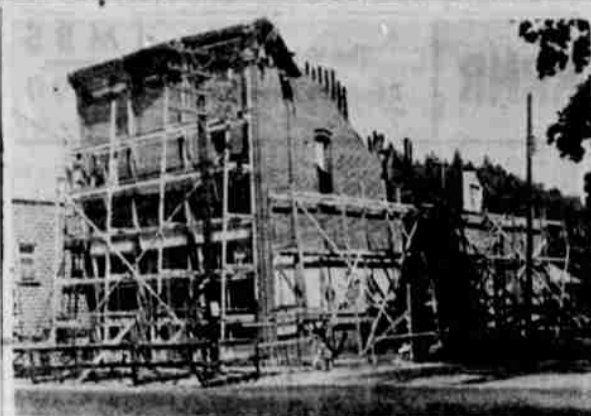
CHICAGO, Aug. 20.—(AP)—The annual lake-front football pageant will be on display in Soldier Field tonight when the College All-Stars meet the champion Chicago Cardinals in the 15th annual game of the series. A crowd of 100,000 or more is expected to watch the collegians attempt to make it three victories in a row over the professional champions. Last year the Stars defeated the Chicago Bears, 16 to 0, while in 1946 they blanked the Los Angeles Rams by the same score. The National Football League champions, however, hold the edge in the series with seven victories, five defeats and two ties. Tonight marks the first appearance of Coach Jimmy Con-

zelman's Chicago Cardinals in the pre-season football spectacle. Notre Dame's Frank Leahy, coach of the All-Star squad for the second consecutive year, will aim a twin offensive at the Cardinals in the form of a T-formation unit led by Notre Dame's Johnny Lujack and a single wing combination spearheaded by Charlie Conery, Mississippi's great passer. On the single wing side also will be such expert passers as Bob Chapruis, Michigan; Herman Wedemeyer, St. Mary's; and Howard Yerges, also of Michigan.

The college squad of 71 players number 14 men from last season's undefeated Notre Dame squad. Michigan placed nine men.

Competition for Major Baseball Talent Keen Among Alert Scouts

MILES CITY, Mont.—(AP)—Promising young baseball players never want for big league offers—and there's plenty of room in the \$7,000 to \$15,000 salary bracket, says Don Lindberg of the Brooklyn Dodgers.

Lindberg's talk to a local civic club was full of incidents which make his little-known job an interesting one.

"I went to a small town in Idaho this spring after I heard of a very promising young pitcher there," Lindberg said. "When I arrived, had plenty of company—there were 11 big league scouts rushing the lad off his feet."

"After several days of tryouts and sales talks, the boy had narrowed the field down to either the Dodgers or the Yankees, and he was more than partial to the Dodgers."

Suit Asks Damages In Logging Mishap

Alvin Pitt has filed suit in circuit court asking for general damages of \$12,000 and special damages of \$800, to cover loss of wages, for alleged injuries to his wrist in a logging accident. Named as defendants are Daisy, Kenneth, James and Robert Whitlow, doing business as the Whitlow Logging Company.

The complaint states the defendants were engaged in yarding and logging under contract to E. K. Woods Lumber Company in operation at Scottsburg. The plaintiff alleges that on July 18, 1947, while employed by the defendant as a choker setter he was struck on the wrist by the excess slack in a "haul back" line.

Pitt alleges that after he had set a choker in a large fir log preparatory to the dragging of the log on the "main line," before he had the opportunity to "get in the clear," Kenneth Whitlow, as head rigger, ordered the log to be pulled by the donkey by giving the "go ahead" signal through the whistle punk to the donkey engineer, Robert Whitlow.

He alleges he sustained a severe and permanent injury to the left wrist, depriving him permanently of its full use.

"In fact, we encourage youngsters to continue their education before entering baseball," Lindberg said.

The money? Lindberg said salaries for big league range from \$7,000 to \$15,000 for six months' work.
