Military Rites Will Be Held For Orville R. Rodley

Military services will be held Aug. 26 at Golden Gate cemetery, San Bruno, Calif., for Orville M. Rodley, former resident of Lookingglass, who was killed in combat at Anzio, Italy, Jan. 26, 1944. Born in Chicago, Jan. 12, 1919, he came with his parents to Lookingglass in the fall of 1932. He graduated from Lookingglass High School and was employed in

1938 in Seattle by a contracting firm until the time of his enlistment in the Army in 1941. As a member of the 15th (Can Do) Infantry Regiment of the Third Division, he participated in the landings on Morocco, Nov. 8, 1942, and served through the Sicilian campaign.

Surviving are his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Gerliard Rodley; two sisters, Mrs. Harry Kemp and Greta Rodley, and a brother, Irving S. Rodley, all of Seattle, Wash.
