Warden Believes Lifer Innocent Of Murder Charge

SEATTLE, Aug. 28. — (AP) — Washington state's prison warden was quoted by the Seattle Times today as being convinced of the innocence of a man who has served 13 years for a Spokane murder conviction.

The inmate is Clarence G. Bogle, 35. He is serving a life sentence for the killing of elderly Moritz Peterson in the latter's Spokane home in 1933.

It was reported from Walla Walla last week that Bogle's case had been laid before Governor Wallgren.

Tom Smith, acting Prison Supt., said today:

"I am convinced Bogle is innocent—and you may quote me."

It said another important factor in the case is the long-time contention of a daughter of the slain man that Bogle's conviction was a miscarriage of justice.

Bogle, a former Oregon lumberjack, had two robbery convictions against his record at the time of his murder trial. He was sentenced from Linn County, Ore., in 1924. He was sentenced also, with several others, for a 1933 robbery at Mullen, Idaho, but was later given a pardon by the governor.

He was taken into custody on the Spokane murder case upon his release from the Idaho prison.

Boost in Productivity, Wages are Compared

WASHINGTON, Aug. 30. — (AP) — The magazine "Factory" reported Saturday that a survey covering 1,400,000 workers showed productivity up 4.4 percent in the year ended August 2.

The magazine, publishing the results of its second annual survey, said wages, by comparison, had gone up 9.7 percent in the last year.

The survey covered 610 companies and about 10 percent of total employment in the manufacturing industries.

The first survey, covering 19 months, found wages up 23.3 percent, and a productivity increase of 5.5.

Henry Wallace Movement Draws Oregon AFL Rap

PORTLAND, Aug. 30. — (AP) — The Oregon State Federation of Labor Saturday condemned the Henry Wallace movement, then threw its support to two Democrats and one Republican running for state office.

Endorsed for the November ballot were Lew Wallace, Democratic candidate for governor; Walter J. Pearson, Democratic candidate for state treasurer; and George Neuner, Republican attorney general.

On Wallace the federation's executive board said, "our feeling is that the Wallace leftist party is a menace to Democratic government... and no candidate on any ticket who supports the Henry Wallace movement should be supported by any union member."

The board cited this reason for failing to endorse Byron G. Carney, Democratic candidate for secretary of state and state Democratic chairman.

It said he "openly embraces" the Wallace movement and should "have the decency to resign his party post in the Democratic party."

The board also did not endorse incumbent Earl T. Newbury on the basis of his votes on labor issues while a member of the legislature.

The board also endorsed six measures on the November ballot and urged defeat of four others.

Those recommended: liberalizing provisions of the 6 percent constitutional amendment; permitting sale of liquor by the drink; restoring high income tax exemptions; eliminating property ownership qualifications for voting in school elections; eliminating certain types of Columbia River fishing gear; permitting transfer of surplus tax funds to the general fund.

It urged defeat of: the state veterans' bonus bill; the old age pension bill; the bill to permit construction of the Idaho Power Company's proposed dam on the Snake river; the bill to issue state bonds for reforestation.
