SEATTLE, Aug. 31. —(AP) — A patient Columbia University law professor told here today of a monumental task he has undertaken to rewrite the commercial law code so it will be understandable to laymen.

Karl N. Llewellyn, here in connection with the national conference of commissioners on uniform state laws, said he started his work in 1940 and expects to be finished in 1950. When he is through, he said, he will have a volume of 250 pages, compiled at a cost of \$1,000 a page.
