

Grid Talk Favors Oregon U. Ducks, California Bears

(By the Associated Press)

With the California Bears and the Oregon Ducks already rated by some experts as the teams to beat, football practice gets under way in the Pacific Coast conference today.

Based on their record of nine wins in 10 starts for Coach Lynn (Pappy) Waldorf in his first year at Berkeley, the Golden Bears hold the limelight. The University of Oregon, with Norm Van Brocklin rating as the coast's top passer, seems the team most likely to stop the Bear march to the Rose Bowl.

That was the talk on the coast today, but it suited the plans of neither Waldorf nor Coach Jim Aiken of Oregon. Both prefer to have the University of Southern California, last year's champion squad, remain as the favorite, at least through the early season.

In fact, there wasn't a coach on the coast who would admit to prospects of even getting out of the conference cellar.

At Spokane, Wash., coaches of the northwest schools gathered yesterday and held an advance wake for the coming season.

Doug Fessenden, veteran mentor of Montana State University, was the optimist of the lot.

"I think Montana will be able to defeat any of the northwest's junior colleges," opined Doug.

Dixie Howell of the University of Idaho and Phil Sarboe of Washington State both conceded they would lose to the other in the traditional battle between the two schools.

Reg Root, University of Washington line coach, assured one and all that Washington would be going great guns if it just could field 11 men throughout the season—which opens with Minnesota and closes with Notre Dame.

Root will coach the Washington team until Howie O'Dell, who replaces Pest Welch as U. W. head man this year, recovers from a kidney ailment which has him nalled down in a Seattle hospital.

In the south, Coach Jeff Cravath goes to work on a squad which is but a scant part of last year's championship USC combination.
