

Navy Speed Flier Injured In Crash of Jet Plane

VAN NUYS, Calif., Sept. 13.—(AP)—Capt. James F. Fitzgerald Jr., 28, one of the nation's fastest fliers, lay critically injured today after a jet plane crashup. His TF-80C two-place jet fighter-trainer Shooting Star crashed in a field of rose bushes yesterday 300 yards north of Metropolitan Airport here. He had flown alone from Murco air force base, where he was stationed. Witnesses said he was making an approach to the runway here when the plane dipped, dug its left wing into the ground and somersaulted. Extent of his injuries was not announced.

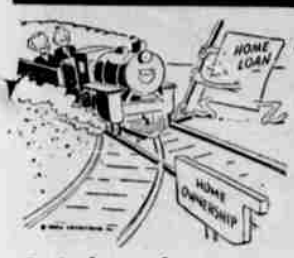
Wholesale Price Index Shows Minor Reduction

WASHINGTON, Sept. 13.—(AP)—The Bureau of Labor Statistics wholesale price index declined .5 percent for the week ended Sept. 4, mainly because of "sharply lower prices for fresh meats, livestock and poultry." BLS said the decreases more than offset higher prices for grains. The index for the week was 167.4, compared with the 1926 average of 100. The index is 1.1 percent less than the record high for the index of 169.2 two weeks ago. But it still is 8.1 percent above the same week in 1947. Food prices dropped 2 percent during the week.
