Autographed Wooden Leg War Trophy of Flier

SYDNEY, Australia—(AP)—The wooden leg of an Australian aviator is likely to end up in the Australian War Memorial at Canberra. The leg belongs to Steve Stephens of Perth.

Stephens lost his left leg in a car accident when he was three. In spite of his handicap and in the face of many relations, he won his way into the Royal Australian Air Force and served two years in the United Kingdom as a bomber rear gunner. His wooden leg, of Japanese oak, is carved all over with the names and initials of airmen who served with him.

Now 26, Stephens is a fine athlete in spite of the loss of his leg. He has cleared 4 ft. 9 in. in the high jump, run the 100 yards in 17 seconds, ridden a mile on the cycle track in three minutes, and covered the hilly 60 miles between Perth, Western Australia's capital, and Northam in 4½ hours. Stephens also dances well.

Judge Wimberly Plans Brief Hunting Trip

Circuit Judge Carl E. Wimberly has completed his jury term at Toledo, but will be in Roseburg only a couple of days, he said. He is planning a brief hunting trip, then will return to Toledo Oct. 11 for his monthly motion day. 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School Gridster Fatally Hurt, Second in Hospital

ABINGTON, Mass. Sept. 28.—(AP)—A 16-year-old Abington high school football player died today and a second—also 16—was in a serious condition from injuries suffered within the past week in a game and in practice scrimmage.

Edward Snyder, Jr., died in the South Shore hospital, South Weymouth, this morning where he was taken a week ago today with a ruptured spleen suffered

in a practice scrimmage with Braintree high school.

Also hospitalized was his teammate John Ruzicki, whose left kidney was removed in an operation yesterday because of injuries suffered Saturday in a game with Ipswich high school.
