### New Anti-Red Bloc Looms

Meanwhile, a new bloc of 12 Middle Eastern nations, which might radically alter the voting line-up in the U. N., was reported in progress.

Foreign ministers and chief delegates to U. N. of the nations concerned have scheduled a meeting for tomorrow. A well informed Greek source said a cohesive group will be established at that time.

All 12 nations have shown somewhat anti-Soviet sentiments, and they all stand in the shadow of the Russian bear. Their more immediate tie is the current situation in Palestine, where members of the Arab League have sought to prevent establishment of a Jewish state.

The member countries occupy adjoining parts of three continents: Europe, Africa, and Asia. They are Greece, Turkey, Afghanistan, Egypt, Ethiopia, Iraq, Iran, Lebanon, Pakistan, Saudi Arabia, Syria, and Yemen. All except Greece and Ethiopia are predominantly Moslem, and all the Arab League nations belong to U. N. would be included.

make a considerable reduction in living costs."

Wallace charged his Republican opponent, Douglas McKay, with three shifts in policy with regard to state income taxes.

Speaking on the subject of "Looking forward in Oregon," Wallace said that the state has "no oil, no natural gas and practically no developed coal, but we have potential hydroelectric energy equal to sixty Bonnevilles—more than the rest of the United States combined." He urged vigorous efforts by state authorities to encourage, in cooperation with the federal government, the earliest possible expansion of Oregon's power resources.

### Outdated Laws Rapped

Claiming that state administrations "do not know that the horse and buggy days are over," Wallace declared that the state game code has been virtually unchanged since it was created by Governor Oswald West in 1912; that "Knox law operation has continuously deteriorated," that the milk control law has been a failure, tending to "force reduction of consumption while decreasing production;" that administration of school lands has "left Oregon with only a fraction of what it should have for its 200,000 school children."

"I am not campaigning on a basis of criticism," Wallace declared, "but I must mention these things that I might explain the remedies I will propose when elected governor."

Wallace proposed that the

administration of school lands in the state of Washington and the state of Oregon reveals the fiasco in this state," Wallace declared.

Wallace proposed that no land be sold if it can be leased for a long period of time; that sales of timber land be made at auction bid only; with the board of control retaining the right to reject all bids.

He contended that the state should reserve hunting and fishing rights to the general public on all lands sold or leased, pointing out that large acreages, having great recreational value, have been leased on long-term contracts to individuals who bar the public from recreational use of the land. He contended that income could be greatly increased if right of access for recreational purposes was retained.

game commission be made a planning body only, and that membership be enlarged to a minimum of 11 commissioners; that the game director be appointed for a period of not less than 10 years and that he be vested with complete authority over fish and game matters, and that he not be removed except for cause. Increase in membership, he said, would give "direct contact between the commission and the people interested in fish and game."

### Knox Law Operation Hit

Declaring his opinion that "the Knox law as operated for the past 10 years in Oregon has been a disgrace to the state," Wallace said that he would propose that no person selling liquor to the state would be eligible for public office. He urged that, because Oregon is a monopolist liquor state, dealings for the purchase of liquor be conducted directly between the distillers and the state without an intermediate.

"The state's purchase of the Waterfill and Frazer distillery a few years ago," Wallace said, "resulted in a fee of a million dollars for one man, the money coming from the pockets of the aged people of Oregon. Repeatedly since then large fees have been paid politicians and others dealing in liquor."

To avoid political control over the liquor commission, Wallace advocated that all appointments to the commission be confirmed by the state senate.

"I propose to take liquor out of politics and politics out of liquor," Wallace said.

Turning to the problems of another beverage, Wallace proposed a committee of milk producers, distributors, consumers and cooperative dairymen to "prepare legislation to accomplish what our present milk law is supposed to do."

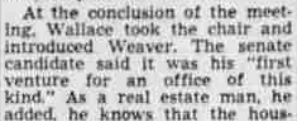
