One Moscow broadcast this week charged the Iranian government with failing to carry out an amnesty order freeing pro-Soviet leaders rounded up after the Russian troops withdrew.

Another claimed that Iran is about to enter an Arab bloc which "will serve the interests of the Anglo-American monopolists of the Middle East."

A third reported that danger of "famine" is increasing in Iran.

Meanwhile the clandestine Azerbaijan Station was calling the "Shah, Iran's ruler, a traitor because of his talks with British officials in London."

Oregon to Battle Michigan, O. S. C. Takes on Huskies

LOS ANGELES, OCT. 1.—(AP)—For the second successive week, football teams of the Pacific Coast conference face perilous tasks.

Two Big Nine opponents are on the slate. And for better or worse, national interest will focus tomorrow on Oregon's encounter with Michigan at Ann Arbor, and Southern California's invasion of the Ohio State stronghold at Columbus.

Back on the coast, Oregon State takes on the Washington Huskies at Portland. Stanford meets Washington State at Pullman. UCLA entertains Idaho all in conference competition, and the Golden Bears of California draw what could be an easy touch in the Gaels of St. Mary's at Berkeley.

Washington State and Stanford should put on a tight ball game. The Indians are rapidly improving and Washington

State is a much better team than indicated in its lone game to date, a 48-26 loss to UCLA Sept. 18. The same holds true for both Washington and Oregon State. The latter received nothing but bad breaks in bowing to USC last Saturday night, 21-6, and the Huskies need not be ashamed of their loss to Rose Bowl candidate Minnesota.

Idaho has lost to Oregon State and Utah shouldn't offer UCLA much trouble, while Montana should take Pacific University in a non-conference affair at Missoula.

Pacific Livestock Fair Opens With Record Prize List

PORTLAND, Oct. 1.—(AP)—The 38th annual Pacific International Livestock Exposition opened here today with a prize list totaling \$126,955, the largest on record for the show.

Nine evening and four afternoon horse show and rodeo performances will be presented before the exposition closes Oct. 9.

Visitors to the exposition building, the largest in the west covering 11 acres, will see exhibits from 24 Oregon counties, other states and territories and even foreign countries. Alaska and Mexico will exhibit this year for the first time.

Besides a big entry list from 4-H Club boys and girls and members of the Future Farmers of the top livestock in the west will compete for the awards. The poultry premium list totals \$1600, and there's a special barley prize of \$2000 in cash plus a combine harvester.

A special feature of the horse and rodeo shows will be the appearance of the Royal Canadian Police drill team. It will be the group's first public performance since before the war.

Poultry judging starts today, but the main livestock judging will not begin until Monday.
